**WHAM News, Views and Reviews:** We are very sad to hear of the passing of long time member Dan Walton. Words can't always hit the mark in conveying the value or esteem of a man, but Bill Schmidt comes pretty close here:

#### I KNEW DAN WALTON

Dan Walton was a friend of mine. I first met him on the old Beech flying field At 13th and Webb Road about 1981. Right from the beginning I noticed what a pleasant and fun personality he possessed. I also noted that he had a affinity for unusual design models and not necessarily the run of the mill types that abounded on the field. He always seemed to show up with some subject that made you stop and look. I remember his Lil Misery flying wing that flew well and I thought to myself that I would probably never would have landed on it as a 1/2A Texaco subject. He had many articles published in Flying Models that were simple fun type models such as his "Gym Dandy" CO-2 powered for indoor as well as outdoor flying. His forward thinking resulted in the first airborne VCR camera plane in the area some


30 yrs. ago. I still have a VHS movie of his big plane circling the Dr. Alley flying field that is very interesting to watch.

Perhaps the most stunning of his endeavors was his perfect scale model of Howard Hughes HK-1 "Spruce Goose" R/C sporting 8 Cox Tee Dee .010 engines. Dan had the starting procedure down pat and could light all 8 engines very quickly--kinda zip-zip-zip. What a sight and what a sound! Truly a memorable event witnessed by several of the club members that Saturday.

Dan was instrumental in helping me win the Grand Champion Awards at both the South West Regionals in Buckeye AZ and then the Grand Champion Award at Sequin TX in 1987. This took a lot of effort on the part of Dan and Jack Phelps and wife Marilyn. I did not care to repeat the performance as it was too much work and I didn't want to ruin my hobby.

He got married a bit later to Cindy and moved to some acreage in El Dorado KS. He has been an engineer at Beechcraft aircraft since moving here from CA as a young college graduate. It was about this time in the early nineties that Dan developed Rheumatoid Arthritis and it slowly began to take that sparkle and verve away from him. It grew progressively worse with added further complications and harsh medications that finally resulted in his death. Farewell good friend, many of us will remember you. -Bill Schmidt

Bill Schmidt also has this to share with us. He painstakingly culled this valuable information from the various plans:


