BACKGROUND

In 2018 an international conference was held by the UNECE, Bundesverband PPP e.V. and KfW-IPEX Bank GmbH and with organizational support of SDG.17 Consulting GmbH to reflect on United Nations Sustainable Development Goal number 17 and the different forms of public-private partnerships as a means of achieving the UN 2030 Development Agenda (more information about the conference launched last year could be found here. <https://www.sdg17consulting.de/kfw-ppp-conference>

Germany has developed its response to the Sustainable Development Agenda in the health sector and established in 2019 the Global Health Hub Germany. Global health is perceived as a cross-sectoral challenge. In this context, the German Government has defined a framework for action in its strategy paper on global health that outlines the following priorities:

- strengthening health systems throughout the world – facilitating development;
- increasing intersectoral cooperation – interaction with other policy areas;
- promoting health research and the health care industry – providing important impulses for global health;
- strengthening the global health architecture.

Last year Geoffrey Hamilton, United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE), presented a concept of ‘People-first’ PPPs, – a new generation of PPPs whose overall goal is sustainable development and which puts people interests at its core. One year later it is important to learn how the concept of PfPPP has matured and transposed into practice through various activities, e.g. development of international standards, and translating PfPPP principles in concrete actions and projects. The second international conference “People-first” PPPs in the Health Sector –an instrument to achieve SDGs. Taking Joint Action. Embracing Responsibility” is being organised within Global SDG Week (Act4SDGs) that takes place from 20 till 30 September 2019.

PURPOSE

- To discuss how the private sector in the health industry and elsewhere might take a lead in the advancement of people-first PPPs and the capacity development programmes in the health sector in order to achieve the Global Health Agenda and Sustainable Development Goals;
- To discuss sustainable finance and innovative solutions for PPPs in the health sector;
- To connect international stakeholders with the German health industry.

Questions to be discussed:

- What is the contribution of Germany (public and private sector) in order to achieve SDGs and the Global Health Agenda; how to make sure that healthcare projects are SDG compliant and demonstrate value for people?
- What German industry has to offer to assist the developing countries to improve their health systems?
- What are the needs of governments in developing countries in response to the Global Health Agenda?
- How establishment of German ecosystem on digital solutions for global health could contribute in achievement of SDGs and global health agenda? How innovative solutions (AI, IoT, Blockchain) could contribute to an improvement of the Global Health Agenda, healthcare infrastructure, health financing and SDGs?
- Are the current solutions for PPPs in the healthcare SDG-viable and climate resilient?
- Could the healthcare infrastructure projects be financed sustainably?
