The recipient of our American Lawyers Alliance Book Donation Project for the 2016 Annual Meeting is the CHILD CARE LAW CENTER. The Child Care Law Center's attorneys work to break down the legal barriers standing between families in need and good, affordable child care. They educate parents and child care providers, advise advocates and policymakers, provide legal information and referrals, and litigate high-impact cases.

They envision a California where child care is a civil right, not a benefit; where equal opportunity begins with equal access to safe and healthy child care; and where parents can support their families without sacrificing their children's well-being.

They work on federal and state subsidies, regulation and licensing, civil rights and disability, housing rights, and economic development and planning.

They also serve as a Support Center for Qualified Legal Services Programs in the state of California.

The Executive Director, Kim Kruckel, was delighted when I contacted her and offered the donation of books to the Center. The Child Care Law Center works directly with children; parents, lawyers and child care providers. The books we donate will be distributed, as they are needed, among those individuals and agencies they support. If you would like to learn more about this project, please visit their website, www.childcarelaw.org.

Ms. Kruckel, and a board member from the Child Care Law Center, will visit our meeting on Thursday, August 4. We will present her with our donation and learn more about the goals of the CCLC. You may bring your books to this meeting, send them to the hotel in care of me if you will not be attending the meeting, or order books from Amazon, or another provider, and have the books sent directly to the Center. If you send books to the Center please include your name and that you are a member of the ALA. Books for children five years old and younger will be most appreciated. Books in Spanish and, if possible, Chinese will also be a nice fit for the children they serve. Your response to this project has been amazing!! Thank you, thank you for helping the American Lawyers Alliance make a difference and leave this small footprint in the cities we visit.

They are waiting with much anticipation to begin a TLA Cultural Arts Experience in deep East Texas. Why Longview and East Texas one might ask. Good question – however, surprising, as it may seem, there are several movies that depict various events in and the culture of East Texas. These movies became the entertainment for the weekend.

So off the TLA went!! Thursday night found them dining while watching the movie *"Tomato Republic"*. This documentary tells the story of the mayors' race in Jacksonville, Texas, the Tomato Capital of Texas. A flamboyant restaurateur, a good ol' boy and a political ingénue, walk into a small town political contest head to head to head, for the non-paid mayoral seat of the Tomato Republic.

Friday morning they toured the East Texas Oil Museum on the Kilgore College campus. This museum houses the authentic recreation of oil discovery and production in the early 1930s from the largest oil field inside U. S. boundaries. And the wells of the East Texas Oil Field are still pumping today. After the history lesson and lunch they enjoyed *"Bernie"*, staring Jack Black, Shirley MacLaine and Matthew McConaughey. The movie is based on the true story of the 1996 murder of 80-year-old millionaire Marjorie Nugent by her 39-year-old companion, Bernie Tiede. The movie was produced by S.R. Bindler and financed by Mathew McConaughey, who both grew up in Longview. Harold passed away peacefully on March 19, 2016. He was born June 9, 1936 in Sparta, Wisconsin. And subsequently moved to Texas where he worked on his family's shrimp boat as a young boy. After that he moved with his mother to Anchorage, Alaska where he graduated high school. He began college at Washington State University and finished at San Jose State where he met his loving wife of 56 years, Billie. After college Harold served his country in the Army while station at Fort Ord. He later became a police officer for San Jose and then an investigator for the State of California. He subsequently made a career change, attending Lincoln law school at night, after which he engaged in private practice until being appointed commissioner to the Santa Clara County Bench. He enjoyed golf and spending time with his buddies at the Elks Lodge in San Jose. He is survived by his wife, Billie, sons Jim (wife Janet) and Ken (wife Kelly), and grandchildren Kelsey and Anthony.

Thoughts and prayers go out to the family of Jane Herndon, who passed away on September 27, 2015. Jane was President of National Lawyers Wives (now ALA) 1971-72.

Jane was born in 1928 and passed away from natural causes. She graduated from Natural Bridge High School, and subsequently attended Virginia Polytechnic Institute (now Virginia Tech) where she was a member of the Virginia Players and graduated with a degree in Biology in 1951. At the time, she was one of only 50 women at the university and the only woman in the Pre-Med program. She was very active in the Huntington community, including many years with the Junior League, Garden Club, Women's Club and Cabell County Bar Auxiliary. In 1971, she was installed as President of the National Lawyers Wives in London, and later sat on the Executive Committee of the World Peace Through Law Center's Conference in Belgrade, Yugoslavia. She chaired the Galleries Ball fundraiser for many years for the Huntington Museum of Art to which she and her husband were patrons. Jane was a long-standing member of First Presbyterian Church in Huntington. She will be remembered by all as someone who enjoyed life to the fullest and received others with a warm smile and kind words. One of her greatest joys was playing the lead role in "Driving Miss Daisy" with the Kanawha Players of Charleston, WV in 1993. She was preceded in death by her husband of 64 years, Milton T. Herndon. She is survived by her children: Dr. Deborah Herndon, Dr. Boyd Herndon, Marion Herdon Fuqua and Thomas Herndon.
