




Reminder – what are the SDGs

The first 6 people-focused goals




The 17 Sustainable Development Goals

	End poverty in all its forms everywhere
	End hunger, achieve food security and improved nutrition, and promote sustainable agriculture
	Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages
	Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote life-long learning opportunities for all
	Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls




The next 4 goals – Economy and Access to Services

 <p>7 AFFORDABLE AND CLEAN ENERGY</p>	Ensure access to affordable, reliable, sustainable, and modern energy for all
 <p>8 DECENT WORK AND ECONOMIC GROWTH</p>	Promote sustained, inclusive, and sustainable economic growth, full and productive employment, and decent work for all
 <p>9 INDUSTRY, INNOVATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE</p>	Build resilient infrastructure, promote inclusive and sustainable industrialisation and foster innovation
 <p>10 REDUCED INEQUALITIES</p>	Reduce inequality within and among countries

Goals where cities have a special role –though all goals are relevant

	Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient, and sustainable
	Ensure sustainable consumption and production patterns
	Take urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts

Goals for the planet

	<p>Conserve and sustainably use the oceans, seas, and marine resources for sustainable development</p>
	<p>Protect, restore, and promote sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems, sustainably manage forests, combat desertification, and halt and reverse land degradation and halt biodiversity loss</p>
	<p>Promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, provide access to justice for all and build effective, accountable, and inclusive institutions at all levels</p>

Each community must set its own priorities

Progress –publicly monitored and reported

Stepping-stone goals are needed for 2020 and 2025
Compare progress and learn lessons from other communities

Lessons from Bristol

- 1 Don't reinvent the wheel – build on what's already underway
- 2 Don't wait for new money – use what's already there but focus it better
- 3 Mobilize and challenge local businesses and other groups
- 4 Monitor and report regularly –through press, to NGOs and social media
- 5 Create an SDG Ambassador responsible
 - for giving SDGs publicity
 - for keeping the SDGs before the Council
 - to help mobilize business groups
 - to spread awareness of SDGs in schools
