Here the politicians select their voters with Gerrymandering to create safe seats for themselves, and to prevent the majority of voters to get a majority representation in state houses and congress. Power corrupts. The US is minority ruled at this point. And it is ruled by the golden rule; who has the gold makes the rules, and the rules are made so that the golden boys get more and more of the gold. Look at the Trump Tax cuts. When Trump was campaigning he promised to remove the unfair carried interest taxation rules which are a sweetheart tax rat on the income that hedge fund managers collect from their investors. The little people don't own stocks, so the stock market bonanza has not benefited them. The only thing that has blossomed is the red ink in the federal budget which ran close to a trillion dollars in the last fiscal year. And that at a time of very low unemployment where the federal government should improve its financial position to build ammunition to fight the next recession. It is not a question if that will come; only when. I think that at this point the little people should understand that tax cuts for the rich only produce "golden showers", and I am not talking about the ones made with the chemical element "Au". I hope the US is also grateful for all the income taxes that I paid over 20 years. I think Germany has missed out a bit. When they gave me their free education they were

probably hoping that one day I would pay all the money back, and then some. That may still happen. At least I continue to pay into Germany's retirement system, albeit at the minimum contribution level. This way they do not forget me, and in case I go back one day I could still return into their retirement system. The products that I am developing here in the US together with colleagues from many different Nationalities are integrated circuits for fiber optic communications. They are manufactured in Taiwan. One of our customers is a company in Germany, and so thanks to my work in the US they are able to sell competitive products world wide. Through this indirect route Germany is still benefiting from the education that they funded for me. It is important to see the complex global interconnectedness that we live in today. Higher education in America is very expensive these days. Public funding has atrophied, and there are many for-profit universities as well. Many students finish school with six-figure debt loads and degrees that will make it very hard for them to retire that debt. It will probably keep many of them down for most of their lives. A for-profit university has inherently conflicts of interest. Shareholders will ask for growing profits, the university spends significant amounts of money to attract the next group of students (customers), and all that money is not spent to provide actual education to the students. And to make all that even worse people have to worry about falling prey to scams like Trump University!

I am sorry to take such a winding road to start to talk about my concerns, but I wanted to first

#### Healthcare

share with you that I have an outsider's perspective on many of the questions and problems that I have been observing in the US over the 20 years that I have been living here. I already discussed education. A second important issue is healthcare. Having grown up in Germany I feel that universal healthcare for all people in the country is a basic human right in a developed society. When you look at Germany, you can see that they are actually quite successful despite, or I would say, rather because of, the availability of good healthcare for everybody. Smart and healthy people are Germany's most important resource in the global village. The healthcare system in the US is characterized by its much higher cost compared to other developed countries, and a large number of uninsured people. A lot of the healthcare system is in the hands of for profit health insurance companies and for profit hospitals. They have the same conflict of interest as the for profit universities that I mentioned above. Should the health care company pay \$2,000,000.00 on a gene therapy for a newborn, or on shareholder dividends, or their CEO bonus? A lot of the money that the healthcare sector extracts from the economy is actually not used to keep people healthy. Under President Obama the Democratic Party spend a lot of their energy and political capital to create the Affordable Care Act (ACA) to reduce the number of uninsured people. To fund the expansion of the healthcare system people were required to buy health insurance, including the young and healthy. People who could not afford the premiums received subsidies. To require everybody to have insurance makes sense when you think about the full life of a person; ultimately most of the young and healthy warriors will end up requiring their share of health care treatments later in their life, too. Nobody knows if they will get cancer or some other disease which would be very expensive to treat. Insurance spreads this risk and ensures that the population as a whole stays healthy and productive

longer. Without health insurance many people in the US are only one sickness away from bankruptcy when expensive healthcare bills push them towards the abyss and to a point where they lose their homes and are forced to live on the street. We have guite a few homeless people in California. The lack of universal health insurance is definitely a contributing factor in this problem and makes it much harder for them to recover from homlessness. And when somebody loses a job with health insurance they are at high risk. You may appreciate the importance of health insurance in the US when I share a personal example. When my son had appendicitis the bill from the hospital for two days including the surgery was close to \$30,000.00. My health insurance company only paid about 15% of that amount as it was pre-negotiated. The provider wrote off 85% of the initial charge! At that point I thought what would have happened if I had to pay the surgery from my own pocket. Would I have been able to shave off 85% of that bill? I don't know, but having to pay close to \$30,000.00 would have been hard. Here you can already see how the people without health insurance are screwed. In surveys on the street, average Americans respond that they would have difficulties to cover an emergency expense of \$400. So most of the time they have to tap into credit cards which may charge 20%, 25%, or 35% interest rates. You would think this is usury when you know about the interest rates that banks pay to the federal reserve (less than 2%) or on the deposits of their savers (0.1% for big banks, but if you are savvy and go online you can also find up to two percent). So why is this HUGE differential in the interest rate not usury? Well, the banks are big contributors to the politicians in Congress. They essentially pay for their protection. Now imagine that due to a medical emergency you have to put \$30,000.00 on a credit card at 35%... How long will it take to pay that off if you can save \$100 a month? Essentially forever, and the balance keeps growing. Back to healthcare.

The Republican Party failed to repeal the ACA under Obama 54 times in the House of Representatives when they had the majority in the House. They finally had a majority in both houses of congress when Donald Trump became President. Even then they failed to repeal the ACA thanks to the late Senator John McCain who cast the deciding vote against repeal in August 2018. It is very strange that the party that claims to care so much about the unborn life that they want to force women to carry babies to term which were conceived through rape, cares so little about human life after babies arrive and start breathing. I think there are also several examples where Republican congressmen rather not receive a baby when they got their mistress pregnant.

After failing to outright repeal the ACA, the Trump administration engaged in administrative sabotage of the ACA as much as they could. They removed the insurance mandate, and claimed afterwards that the law is unconstitutional.

As the question of constitutionality winds its way through the courts to a conservative majority Supreme Court we are back to the schizophrenic situation where people do not have to have health insurance, and at the same time emergency rooms have to treat people even if they do not have insurance. This system does not make much sense when you think about it. The most expensive place to provide emergency care is sometimes used to treat bad colds as people cannot go to a regular doctor.

When the Republicans were working in 2017 to repeal the ACA, Trump made the statement: "Nobody knew health care could be so complicated." He was probably the last to understand that problem.

In my view some of these topics are actually quite manageable if you applied basic financial analysis, common sense, and the will of the politicians to create a fair system for their constituents. Let me give you a very specific example here. The cost of insulin has been in the news recently where people are reportedly dying because they cannot afford the insulin that they need. They reduce the dosage or substitute it with insulin that is meant for animals. Reportedly, a vial of Humalog costs \$300 retail in the US, and about \$30 in Canada. Looking at these two numbers we can immediately draw two conclusions: First, the manufacturing cost of Humalog must be below \$30. Otherwise it would not be sold in Canada for that price. Second, there must be at least \$270 additional profit on the Humalog that is sold in the US. If you look at the business parameters for insulin you will see that the drug is 100 years old, and there are no patent protections to manufacture it. There is also a steady and high demand for it. Taking all of this together, manufacturing of insulin should follow a utility model. It is essentially a very low risk business, and the manufacturer should only earn a small profit margin. The fact that the profit margin is astronomically high proves that the system is rigged against the people whose life depends on insulin. When will the politicians start to fix this outrageous abuse?

## Draining the Swamp

I think it is examples like the above that caused a significant number of people to vote for the outsider, Donald Trump, in the 2016 election, even if they had voted for Barack Obama in 2012. They had the hope that he would fulfill his many promises to drain the swamp, and that he would be more faithful to them than his first two ex-wifes. I can sort of appreciate that dream, but I have to tell you that hope is not a strategy. I actually have several close family members that are very dear to me who made the same choice. As we see in the news, hope dies last. Many of the Trump voters are still hoping that the wall will be paid by Mexico?

Unfortunately, draining the swamp in Washington is significantly harder than the fifth labor that Eurystheus ordered the classical Greek hero Hercules to perform: Cleaning the stables of King Augeas in a single day. Voters intuitively felt that this job should be done by an outsider. However, in voting for Donald Trump with his well known record to stiff small contractors, a large number of credible allegations of sexual misconduct against women, and defrauding students at his infamous Trump University, just to name a few of his many disqualifying acts that voters knew about, they essentially send the biggest bull into the stable to do the clean up. As I and many others expected, this has not improved the situation. Getting conservative judges on our courts does not make up for all the bulls#!t that has been coming from this White House. To the contrary, the mess in our society has gotten much worse. Look at our divisions! The federal budget is bleeding! The pile of excrement has been growing and is stinking to high heaven. The amazing high tech products that humans are able to put together today are only possible with globally sourced materials, supply chains, knowledge, and labor. Trade wars are not helpful, and they are not easy to win. In the end we all lose.

Collaboration, an opposing thumb, and our intelligence are in the end the most important properties of us human beings. They made us so successful that we are on the verge of devouring the natural foundation that we need for our existence. We are sitting on a tree and sawing the branch off that we are sitting on. That image does not quite make us look so intelligent any longer. But hey, at least we were able to make a power saw!

#### **Human Nature**

I like to share my view on human nature and how it is related to the dysfunctional state of affairs that we observe in the political realm in many places in the world, not just the US. Think about Brexit, Brasil, Hungary, etc.

As individuals, human beings are pretty weak and very vulnerable. After we are born we need 24x7 nurturing and protection from our parents for many years before we become productive elements in our society. Even when we are adults we need the protection of the herd for survival. In the stone age, every night, when we had to sleep, we needed to be in safety. We understand the importance to be part of the herd at a very basic level. It is ingrained in our DNA,

## **Bitcoins**

mechanism that can be used to separate fools from their money, or as an anonymous and supposedly untraceable payment mechanism for extortion payments. Let me give you a personal example here. In 2018, I received an anonymous extortion letter in the snail mail where somebody wrote that he had learned my darkest secret, and if I did not pay him 1 Bitcoin, which was the equivalent of about \$8500 at that time, he would share this secret with my wife and neighbors. Now I live a pretty uninteresting life, at least from the perspective of a blackmailer. I am still living happily married to wife 1.0 and don't have any Stormy encounters in my past that could be used to blackmail me. With a quick search on the internet I was also able to confirm that these kinds of letters are sent out as scams frequently. They just try to see if something sticks. Here you see the bad and the good of the internet all in one place! It can be used to scam, but also be used to find the truth. So I just ignored the letter. Looking at the economics of this scam model the scammer had to create a personalized letter that had at least my name on it, print it, attach postage, and put it into the mail. So he had to invest about 50 cents per letter, hoping to find a victim that pays him \$8500. To break even at least one in 17,000 people must have a dark enough secret that they are willing to pay up if we ignore the cost of labor to handle all this. If you consider that the scammer is probably looking for a significant profit margin in this "business", his success rate must actually be significantly higher. The most hilarious part of that blackmail letter where the Bitcoin payment instructions. They ran actually over two pages, and in one paragraph the writer told me to watch out and only work with a Bitcoin payment facilitator who has a 99% positive rating to make sure I would not get scammed. What a caring person!

From an environmental standpoint Bitcoin is awful as it wastes a huge amount of electricity in the competitive process of mining.<sup>14</sup> A recent estimate puts the electric power use at about 7 Gigawatt. That is essentially the equivalent of 7 large nuclear power stations. That is 0.25% of global electricity production to run a gambling/speculation/blackmail payment system. And of course, when Wall Street sees a lucrative way to separate people from their money they are not far behind to get on the train.<sup>15</sup> Volatility is their lifeblood. And even Facebock wants to create its own Cyber currency! Just. Say. No!

The underlying blockchain technology could have definitely beneficial applications for example in securing voting tallies in our election system. But the politicians in Washington, at least some of them, are not really interested in running fair elections. In 2019, Mitch McConnel, the Senate Majority Leader, has blocked Senate voting on election security legislation for a long time. Now if just one politician is against a piece of legislation in a democracy that is part of the system and it can be overruled by the majority. Unfortunately, in the US Senate, the majority leader can stall legislation forever if he wants to. You may remember how Moscow Mitch<sup>16</sup> stalled the Supreme

I have worked as a volunteer for the Irvine Ranch Conservancy since 2011. In that role I guide groups through the protected Open Space on the former Irvine Ranch where our visitors can

essentially enjoy an experience similar to a National Park, minus the crowds. Sign-ups are free at <a href="http://letsgooutside.org">http://letsgooutside.org</a>.

I want to also give a quick shout out to the International Mountain Bicycling Association<sup>24</sup>. They have plans to develop mountain biking trails close to many communities in their "More trails close to home" initiative, so that young and old can enjoy bicycling in nature close to home. Think about how nice it will be to be able to do fun outdoor activities close to home, and in the evening you share your special moments with people around the world. No jet lag or jet fuel required. If many people changed their habits, initiatives like this could make a big difference in saving resources for future generations.

All cultures have stories like this. As our ancestors were sitting in their caves they had to develop their language in lockstep with their technological advancement. Without good language skills our children cannot develop good thinking skills. Complex thoughts cannot be expressed in 140 characters, or even 280. If you get your big flatscreen TV<sup>27</sup>, I like to recommend to you the nature documentaries narrated by David Attenborough.<sup>28</sup> With modern technology these are truly spectacular and provide wonderful insights into many natural mysteries. In the documentary you can see them, in slow motion, one after the other, pushing over the edge, reflexively flapping their fluffy and ineffective little wings. They waddle their feet. Essentially they are now playing the lottery of life. The air friction on their fluffy feathers slow the fall a bit, but we see them bouncing against the cliff, some tumbling, hitting their little heads and then crashing on the ground. In the filmed episode only two or three of the five survive this first challenge in their life. It is super intense, and heart wrenching to see! It is impossible for us not to root for the ducklings to succeed, but nature takes its toll. The geese as a species have been successful, but the cost to the ducklings is high. Human struggle was just like that in the stone ages. Most children died very young! I like to draw yet another parallel between those ducklings and us. Our ancestors have bestowed on us all their technological advancements. We have now hatched and need to start our life with the super large group that we have become thanks to all the great care of our forebears. If we act smart we will be able to figure out a sustainable path to the ground where we all can live, or we continue business as usual, ignoring the danger and problems in our current relationship with the environment and jump over the cliff. Who of us will survive? Maybe the rich think that they will survive in their gated communities.
