Reverend's Reflection

Have you ever heard the saying, "March goes in like a lion and out like a lamb?" Well, I have heard it for years - and even used it in February! The current forecast looks for March to enter as a lamb, so we can expect a lion in late March? Well, so goes the saying.

I was interested in the origins of this saying. Apparently, there are a number of origins from balance of weather to astrology. I read a Christian origin story about the lamb pointing to Jesus at the end of the month. What is interesting is how none of these really are always true when it comes to the weather. Remember the lambs and lions for the entire March? Even the Christian origin of the Lamb at the end of March does not work when Easter is in April.

Like so many sayings, they are always true... when it happens!

But there is one thing constant, sure, and always true: "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." (Heb 13:8). The author of Hebrews declares a sure and certain truth about Jesus.
