We enjoyed the "Trains at Science Park" exhibits and had the opportunity to speak with Peter Higgins, one of the creators and builders of the layouts. One interesting fact is that except for the trains, everything had to be built with theater quality, flame resistant materials, including the paint!

We also enjoyed the movie "Train Time" in the Mugar Omni Theater. Very interesting and exciting story of a real-life engine and crew on the BNSF Railroad.

If you didn't get to see the Museum of Science trains this year, we highly recommend it for next year.

As for the quote from Bob Dylan, our hobby is truly changing. Contrary to opinions recently expressed by some of our members, it is not dead! The O and S gauge toy train hobby is changing. While we are still competing with Sports and Video Games, young people today are buying trains. But they want what they see in real life. And they want the latest in high tech. And in my opinion, for those in the hobby that cannot afford the latest high tech they are looking at used engines with TMCC Cab1 and Proto 1.0 and 2.0 at a lower cost.

While I was at York last October, I spoke to the folks from several large toy train retailers and several *You-Tubers* that have large numbers of followers. They are saying that young people are interested in trains, and they are buying the latest in realism and technology.

Here's a quote from Bob Buehler, of *Bob's Trains 4U*:

"The model train hobby today is dominated by two manufacturers - Lionel & MTH Trains - who compete on who can create the next engine or train feature everyone wants.

The new generation coming into the hobby loves these features, like whistle steam, blow down steam and disappearing coal load in the tender. Since most people under the age of 50 have a cell phone, running their trains on their phone is a requirement.

My business in train sales is dominated by folks wanting fantasy engines and cars and trains that do more than the model trains of years ago".

I am happy to report that our Holiday meet in November was a positive change from September. Thank you for your e-mails, phone calls and even post cards with your comments and suggestions.
