- 1978 Feb. Elected to the Council of the Institute for Workers' Control at its 7th AGM held Nottingham on Feb. 26. (AGM Mins Feb. 78 file:IWC)
- 1981: Is a full-time administrative/secretarial assistant of CAITS paid by Joseph Rowntree Charitable Trust until January 1982. (CAITS report Jan. 1981: Combine Committees).
- March: Is Labour Party candidate in the GLC elections. Has been active in the Labour Party since the age of 14. Works at CAITS, attached to the North East London Polytechnic and lives in the Barbican but is in the process of moving to Wandsworth to be near her constituency. (Time Out 20.3.81 p13: Labour Party)
- May: Has co-ordinated the GLC's reception plans for the Peoples March for Jobs. Is vice-chairman of the industry and employment committee. (News Line 27.5.81 p6)
- Nov: Is described in 'Socialist Challenge' as one of eight women members of the 49 stro Greater London Council (GLC) Labour Group which took office in the spring. Is also described as Vice-Chairperson of GLC's Industry and Employment Committee and a committed socialist feminist. Was interviewed in 'SC' about the sort of policies she wanted to see the GLC implementing on behalf of women. (Socialist Challenge 12.11.81 p10)
- 1981 Nov: Is described as GLC member for Battersea South. Is to be one of the speakers at a Wandsworth Militant Public Meeting on the subject 'Fight Heseltine with socialist action - no cuts, no rate rises'. To be held on 1st December. (Militant 27.11.81.
- Nov: According to an article in 'The Standard' now that John Grant has made it clear his Islington Central constituency party that he will not be seeking re-selection I hear that Valerie Wise is sniffing round the place. Young Miss Wise, whose mother Audrey is the former MP for Coventry South West, is a GLC councillor for Battersea South. (The Standard 11.11.81 p6:Local Govt)
