The above is condensed from the reports in the Adjutant General's office, and except as to certain captured regiments must be considered as very nearly correct. The long list of discharges was mostly for wounds or disability. Thousands of the discharged died on their way home or remained invalide for life.

The number of officers who resigned, not given in the table, is 1,225; the number of offi-

cors dismissed, 56.

Of Iowa soldiers, 12.363 were dead before the war closed, 8,848 had been wounded in battle, and 9,987 had been discharged for wounds or ruined health. This was from an army of strong, young men, averaging less than 25 years of age.
