

Dear Holy Trinity Family...

Happy Lent! We are now in the third week of Lent and time is flying by. Have you been carrying out your Lenten observances of prayer, fasting and almsgiving? I know at times we may falter in our commitments. If that has happened, start up again and try your best to be committed. The evil one tries to get us to give up and quit. That is why the temptation sometimes becomes greater when we are doing something that is spiritual and is building us up in our faith. Don't stop. Keep on going. In our Gospel today, we hear of Jesus cleansing the Temple. Unfortunately, the Temple was changed into a place where people were taking advantage of others. Rather than being a home for God, people filled with greed and selfishness did not treat others with respect or care. It needed to be cleansed and restored and Jesus did just that. Recently you may have heard of a funeral Mass taking place in St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City, just a couple of weeks ago. This beautiful home of God, known as America's Church was violated by individuals in attendance who decided to use this as an opportunity to promote a political agenda rather than truly praying for the soul of the person who had died. I will not repeat the crude and inappropriate things that were said within the sanctuary of the church, otherwise considered where heaven and earth come down on the altar during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. It was so horrific that Cardinal Dolan required a Mass of Reparation take place to sanctify this holy space. Unfortunately, this is becoming too common where our society is losing focus on that which is holy. It is as if sometimes Mass itself becomes something that I go to rather than an encounter with God himself. Likewise, the church then just becomes a place to gather rather than a place to encounter the sacred. I see this at times when we have visitors who come for funerals, or weddings, or baptisms and walk into church with their newly bought Starbucks coffee. We must help one another renew the sense of the sacred so that we can "Be holy just like I am holy." 1 Peter 1:15

In addition to keeping our church sacred, we also must do the same for us ourselves as temples of the Holy Spirit. We cleanse ourselves through the Sacrament of Confessions. We have added times every Friday of Lent at 5:30pm in addition to Saturday mornings at 8:45am. Do not wait to be cleansed. Allow the Lord to work within you.
