SUNDAY OFFERINGS

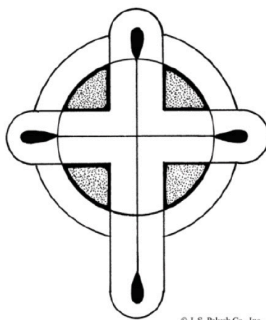
The deposit amount for the Third Sunday in Ordinary time was \$11,482.00. Thank you for your generosity and continued support of Holy Trinity Parish.

Some examples of seemingly little things that can be worth reporting include: A teacher covering her glass classroom door with artwork, eliminating the ability to see into the classroom from the hall; a youth ministry icebreaker activity, where teens have to pass a mint candy from person to person using only toothpicks in their mouth, despite the discomfort of some participants.
