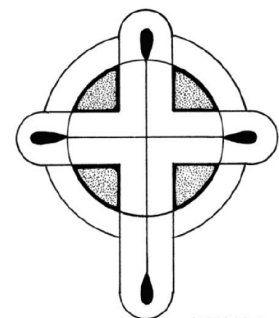

Parents have a responsibility to report concerns they have about another person’s behaviors or actions that could put their children — or any children — at risk. Some examples of seemingly little things that can be worth reporting include: A teacher covering her glass classroom door with artwork, eliminating the ability to see into the classroom from the hall; a youth ministry icebreaker activity, where teens have to pass a mint candy from person to person using only toothpicks in their mouth, despite the discomfort of some participants. St. Joseph - Filii Dei Nutricie (Foster-Father) Joseph shines among all mankind by the most august dignity, since by divine will, he was guardian of the Son of God and reputed as his father among men.

Fr. Calloway teaches us that the English translation, of the latin in this instance is lacking. A more literal translation is “Nurturer of the Son of Man”. St. Joseph’ fatherhood was more than a legal title as Foster-Father, his was an “authoritative, affectionate, faithful and everlasting fatherhood.”

Father Calloway points out that if St. Joseph’s fatherhood was not everlasting then Mother Church would need to cease invoking Jesus as the “Son of Joseph”.
