SUNDAY OFFERINGS

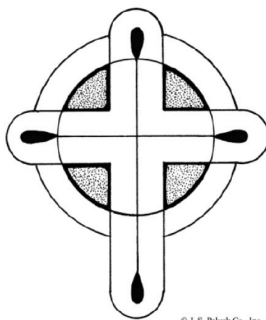
The deposit amount for the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary time was \$6,481.00. Thank you for your generosity and continued support of Holy Trinity Parish.
