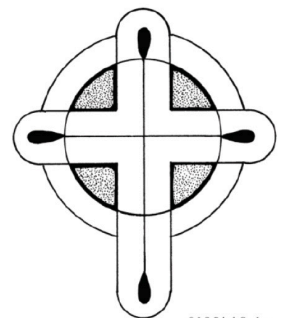

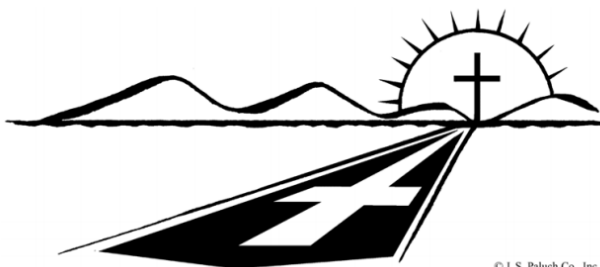
The deposit for the First Sunday of Lent was \$13,640.00. Thank you for your generosity and continued support of Holy Trinity Parish.
