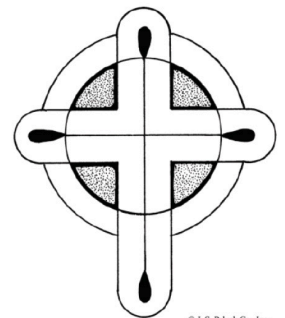

Tools to grow spiritually in the Year of St. Joseph (Dec 8, 2020 – Dec 8, 2021)



The rise of Josephology

In Joseph: The Man Closest to Jesus, Father Francis L. Filas documents the Church's growth in understanding Joseph as next to Mary, the most perfect human person. In the early years of the Church Joseph's role was minimized in order to allow Mary's role to be extolled even greater (how humble Joseph is!). In the Middle Ages the Joseph Movement began. It was in the nineteenth century that Joseph's star began to rise rapidly, beginning with Pope Pius IX declaring Joseph "Patron of the Universal Church. This has been followed by other popes' declarations:

Leo XIII Devotion to Holy Family with emphasis on Saint Joseph

Benedict XV declaring St. Joseph the Patron of the Working men"

Pius XII instituted the feast of St. Joseph the worker  
John XXIII instituted St. Joseph name in the Canon of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass

Francis declared the Year of Saint Joseph
