Friday August 26th- 8:00am Mass, Adoration and 5:00pm Mass


The Church will be locked at 9:30am on Monday August 22nd and reopen at 7:00am on Friday August 26th.

Holy Trinity Parish's Safeguard the Children Committee plays a crucial role in assuring that the safeguard initiatives found in the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People have been made a priority in our parish and school and that the Archdiocesan safe environment programs, policies and procedures are being implemented throughout our parish/school community. All adults over the age of 18 who are involved in volunteer ministry with children must attend a mandatory training session called Protecting God's Children. This initial 2 ½ hour training session will be offered in our parish on Saturday, August 20th at 2:00pm or Thursday, September 1st at 6:00pm. The certificate from this class if good for 4 years. If you need to re-certify, a Keeping the Promise Alive class will be offered in our parish on Saturday, September 10th at 2:30pm or Thursday, September 15th at 6:30pm. These classes are for adults over the age of 18 only and are held in the school. Space is limited and a reservation is required.
