
HOLY TRINITY LOS ANGELES

Be a Trusted Resource if a Child Discloses Abuse. Parents are in a unique position to know about not only their own children, but their children's friends. HOLY TRINITY SCHOOL STUDENT NON-DISCRIMINATION POLICY

Holy Trinity School, mindful of its mission to be a witness to the love of Christ for all, admits students regardless of race, color, national origin, and/or ethnic origin to all rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. The school does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, disability, medical condition, sex, or national and/or ethnic origin in the administration of educational policies and practices, scholarship programs, and athletic and other school-administered programs, although certain athletic leagues and other programs may limit participation and some archdiocesan schools operate as single-sex schools.
