

WIND ENSEMBLE OF TALLINN UNIVERSITY SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA ESTONIA



The wind ensemble of the symphony orchestra from the University of Tallinn was created in order to participate in the Eurochestries festival. The musicians perform in duos, trios, quintet and sextet. These high level musicians have all studied in the various music schools of Estonia and some of them studied in the Georg Ots College of Tallinn (which orchestra participated in the Eurochestries festival in Charente-Maritime last year).

The symphony orchestra of the University of Tallinn was created in 2013 on the initiative of the Estonian association of symphony orchestras et now includes more than 50 students, alumni and administrative personnel of the university.

The soloists ensemble of the orchestra is compounded of Liina Juhanson, Marili Randla, Mirjam Murd, Anita Maasalu, Tõnu Rõõmusaare and Olivier Anni and includes 2 flutes, 1 oboe, 2 clarinets and 1 bassoon.

LIINA JUHANSON (FLUTE)



Liina graduated from H. Eller's Tartu Music College in 2013 and is currently studying social work at the University of Tallinn. She is a member of the Tallinn University Symphony Orchestra since 2014. She has won several national competitions, has performed many times as a soloist and also took part in master-classes of flute and orchestra conducting.

MARILI RANDLA (FLUTE)



Marili is a graduate from the Music School of Türi, she plays in the Tallinn University Symphony orchestra since 2013. She has won several national contests. Marili has played in the Young Estonian wind orchestra as well as in the jazz band Cosmoskva. She currently works for Music Estonia, the centre of development of the music industry and exportation office of Estonia.

MIRJAM MURD (OBOE)



Mirjam has studied flute and oboe at the Music School of Tallinn. Since 2016, she plays oboe and English horn in the symphony orchestra of the University of Tallinn. Mirjam has also played in the wind orchestra of the young people of Estonia, in the symphony orchestra of the G.Ots College and has participated in master-classes. She is currently studying at the Musical College of Tallinn.

ANITA MAASALU (CLARINET)



Anita is a graduate from the Music School of Jõgeva. She has played has a soloist with the Estonian National symphony orchestra of young people. She is currently studying in the G.Ots` Tallinn Music College and plays with its symphony orchestra.

TÕNU RÕÕMUSAARE (CLARINET)



Tõnu is a graduate from the Music School of Vändra. He is a member of the university orchestra since 2014 and has played in the wind orchestra of the young people of Pärnu as well as in the wind orchestra of Põlva. He is currently studying cross media production at the University of Tallinn.

Oliver started his musical studies with French horn but he currently studies bassoon at the Musical College of Tallinn. He has participated in several master-classes. Since 2015 Oliver is a member of the symphony orchestra of the university, he also plays in the symphony orchestra of his school.
