The "S. Richter" Symphony Orchestra was founded in October 1996 at the Richter School of Arts in Moscow. In this school, students are trained for excellence. Until today, the Orchestra has performed more than 450 concerts in Russia and Europe. The orchestra has won many awards. Since 2014, it has been under the direction of Petr Gladysh. With nine appearances at Eurochestries festivals to their credit, the orchestra is back in 2019 in Charente-Maritime.

A graduate of the Tchaikovsky State Conservatory in Moscow, he is currently the first cello of the Russian National Philharmonic Orchestra.
