CBI PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



CBI Friends.

As most of us comfortably await the transition from Winter to Spring, we must remember it has been nearly 120 days since the barbaric attack on over 1200 innocent

lives in Israel on October 7 and there are still 136 beautiful lives being held hostage in Gaza. Let us all pray, as we stand strong with Israel, that the hostages are soon freed from their captors, and they find comfort again with their family and loved ones. With the war continuing and the presence of antisemitism continuing to be actively displayed across our country, your CBI Board has decided to continue its increased security measures at the synagogue and are also seeking grant opportunities to fund additional security infrastructure for our building.

While our search for our new rabbi continues, Shabbat services and Torah Study participation remain strong. This is only possible because of our amazing Ritual Committee consisting of Frank Rios, Gary Blum, Chuck Blend, Sue Williams, Hana Bartlett, Venita Crow, and Rikki Schmitchel. The Ritual Committee also moved quickly when learning about a potential visiting Cantor, and in January we were treated to a wonderful Shabbat weekend led by Cantor Monica O'Desky from the Dallas area. Our visiting rabbi scheduled for February 2 and 3, is currently being rescheduled for later this year. However, please look for information regarding a potential full-time Rabbinic applicant visit that weekend.

We will continue to provide quality services and programs for our congregation, including a special Purim program and dinner on Friday, March 22. We hope to see you all there and join us for the Megillah reading and those tasty three-cornered hamantaschen.

I am pleased to report that the Board elected three new member units to our Congregation in the past two months: Dr. Josh Mintz, Bethany Goldson, and the Gabriel Green family. We welcome them to our Family of Families.


For those not aware, we generally have three types of membership categories all of which require an application and be elected by the Board of Trustees: 1) the first being what I would call the standard CBI Member available for any person of the Jewish faith entitled to all privileges of the congregation, 2) the second being an Associate Member for persons of the Jewish faith that are members of another Jewish congregation but does not reside within 100 miles of Corpus Christi, and 3) a Provisional Member, which are memberships for those persons that are well underway in a formal process to convert to Judaism. 



### GETTING TO KNOW YOU

We are starting a new tradition this month. Future newsletters will have a profile about a member of CBI. Some may be long-time members, or some may be new. No matter who it is, I'm betting that you will find some facts that you didn't already know.



### -OUR FIRST PROFILE IS LESLIE LEVY-

Born and raised in Houston with two brothers and one sister. One of her brothers is deceased. Her mother was a court reporter (before they used a machine), so she had to write all of the testimony by hand. Her father was a research chemist with 100 patents. Her maternal grandparents were both from Poland and her paternal grandfather was from Belarus.

Leslie attended many years of religious school, had her Bat Mitzvah and was Confirmed at Beth Yeshurun. (She was also married there.) Leslie graduated from Bellaire High School in Houston. She attended the University of Texas for two years and graduated from the University of Corpus Christi- now known as Texas A&M with a BA in Elementary Education.

Leslie was married to Carl Levy for 53 years. They met at UT and dated for two years until he graduated. She has two children and two grandchildren. Her son and grandchildren live in Corpus Christi, her daughter lives in Ann Arbor, Michigan.

First job after college was Recreational Assistant at the Jewish Home for the Aged (now called Seven Acres). When Leslie's family heard that the owners were selling the Wiener Department Store, Carl bought it and they moved to Sinton. Leslie mainly focused on raising their two kids and doing volunteer work at that time. She was President of: a Women's club, United Fund, Chamber of Commerce, and the PTA (Fun Fact- Linda Bustillo was a salesperson at Weiner for many years) They owned the store fourteen years and then moved to Corpus Christi around 1986.

Leslie's volunteer work continued here- Driscoll Hospital 3 years, CASA 2 years, JCC and CBI Board where she is currently and has previously been secretary. Speaking of CBI she is driver and sometimes cooks for the Mitzvah Committee, the CBI book club chair, and coordinates with Debbie on the congregation birthday cards. She was a teacher and religious school director at Temple Beth El for 6 years and did 5 years teaching Hebrew for the combined Hebrew school before the merger. There were 80 students back then! She was a Brandeis Book sale worker and a Hadassah member.

For thirty years Leslie taught mostly third and fourth grade at Meadowbrook Elementary. Amazingly, she is still teaching! She works part-time five days a week as a 4<sup>th</sup> grade tutor at Dawson Elementary and four days a week at the Sylvan Learning Center.

Another fun fact- Leslie was the original co-chair of Food Fest with Robin Schriefer. It was mainly the deli and sweet shop back then. Carl's parents owned a Jewish Deli in Corpus Christi for many years and were instrumental with the menu, recipes, and resources. Because it wasn't certain how successful it would be, they rented out craft booths in the social hall. There's a lot more interesting facts about the Food Fest but there isn't enough room. Perhaps more details in a future column.

Hobbies: Voracious reader, loves crossword puzzles, needlepoint and scrapbooking. She also mentioned not liking to fly but being fond of car or train trips and loving cruises. (She's been on four of them, so she's the one to ask if you have any questions.)
