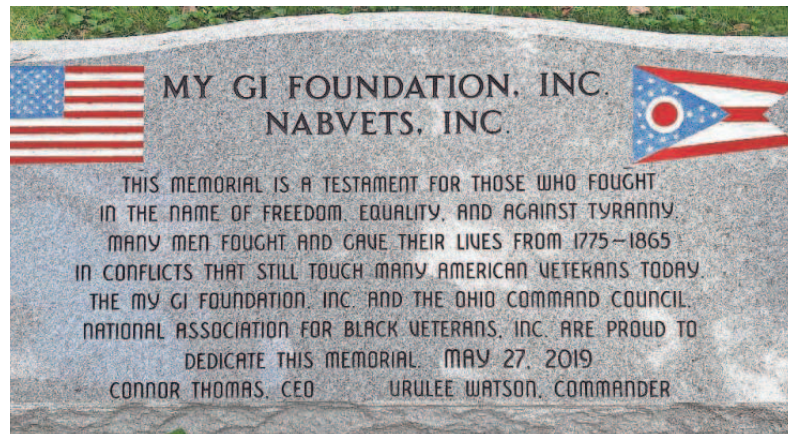

Pioneer Cemetery gets military upgrade

three more semesters and the other is a decorated USMC Captain and Vietnam Veteran and recognized veteran in the Cincinnati military community.

Together they replaced eighteen headstones at the Pioneer Cemetery, the oldest military cemetery in Cincinnati, on 27 May 2019 and My GI Vets placed a large monument there to further honor these veterans from 1790-1867. Connor is the pup in the equation eagerly learning from Mr. Watson how to be a great leader and allow his impact echo through thousands and not just those he comes into contact with.

They have more plans in the works and a chemistry that will overwhelm those they seek assistance from. Connor is proud to have been asked to join both the National Association of Black Veterans and the NAACP. His first big event, at fifteen, was to raise \$10,000 for the Joseph House of Cincinnati in OTR and his volunteerism has exploded since then.

These two have plans in the works and I am sure they will only pick up steam. Their friendship is not

one typically struck, but neither of the two are typical. I am a veteran and very proud of the success they have had together honoring veterans.
