April 2 - Mark 16

In our New Testament Reading Schedule, the reading for April 2 is Mark 16. It's the closing Chapter of Mark's Gospel, and his account of the Resurrection, which is not without a bit of controversy.

In fact, depending on your translation, Mark's Gospel may end after verse 8. If it doesn't end there, it probably has a footnote there saying something like "The earliest manuscripts and some other ancient witnesses do not have verses 9-20." (NIV) It may even speak to some other alternate endings.

Researchers have been able to uncover very early manuscripts of the Gospel Mark, and they do end at verse 8. Most Biblical scholars agree that verses 9-20 were added later, and based on the style of writing, most likely by someone other than Mark.

So what are we to do with these verses? Should we tear these verses from our Bibles, or simply disregard them? I don't think either is necessary, as these "added" words are largely confirmed elsewhere. The words of verses 9-11, focused mainly on Mary Magdalene, are confirmed in John's Gospel. Verses 12-13 are a summary account of the two men on the road to Emmaus which Luke details in His Gospel. Verse 14 speaks to Jesus' meeting with the Eleven. Several such meetings are recorded in the other Gospels.





We do not have exact confirmation of Jesus' words as recorded in verses 15-18, but they sound like other things Jesus said and other

instructions He gave His disciples. Verses 19-20, regarding the Ascension, Jesus' sitting down at the right hand of God and the actions of the New Testament Church, also are right in line with what we know from Scripture.

Perhaps if we want to appreciate what Mark was trying to get across to his readers, we ought to ask the question, why would he

stop at verse 8? It seems like a really strange place to end, almost as if there is no ending at all.

As best we can know, Mark wrote his Gospel at least 25 years after Jesus' death and resurrection. His readers would have clearly understood from oral teaching that the women overcame their fear and delivered the message. They would have known how the disciples responded, and of the subsequent meetings with Jesus, and the eyewitnesses who saw Him. They would have known of the ascension, of Pentecost, of the beginnings of the New Testament church.

Mark was writing to a persecuted church, a church that undoubtedly had many fears to deal with themselves, and he was a preacher. Perhaps the closing note of his message was to force them to confront their own fears, and to consider what would have been lost if these women had allowed fear to control their lives, and never told a soul. Perhaps he wanted them to remember on their own, the great and wonderful things that came about because the women overcame their fear, and to encourage them to carry out what God had given them to do, even in the face of opposition, to resist the inclination to be silent

May those thoughts inspire our witness as well.

My prayer is that this will add to your reading of God's Word.

Board Meeting Updates - February 27, 2024 & March 26, 2024

Treasurer: Monthly budget reports reviewed.

Ministry & Evangelism: Planning events for the coming year including a movie night, Shady Trail worship service, and fall revival services; commission made revisions to community resource booklet that was prepared a few years ago - will look at putting copies at the local community center.

Christian Education: Putting together a "family-friendly" devotional section for the church library; supplied meal for the Pinewood Derby; seeking more info about the camp rep. position from Camp Blue Diamond; discussed hosting a marriage seminar but those plans have been postponed.

Music & Worship: Took orders for tulips & Bibles in early March & ordered palms for Palm Sunday; placed Advent banners in sanctuary and vestibule; helped to compose a survey about Love Feast; preparing for Concert of Praise in April; paid for parts needed to repair sanctuary projector.

Outreach & Service: Planned & hosted annual Easter EggStravaganza (1800 eggs!); assisted with Pinewood Derby; took donations of diapers for Crossroads Pregnancy Center; will give 2024 budgeted Blair Co. Habitat for Humanity donation to the Bedford Co. branch as Blair Co. office is closed.

Property & Finance: Elevator & kitchen fire suppression inspections were completed; prepared list of monthly duties and contractor info for future P&F chairmen; updated duties for maintenance & custodian workers; addressing mouse problem in the kitchen; getting quotes for new basement door & for roof extension over door; emergency exit maps need to be updated; Todd Hoover will paint Fellowship Hall; signs needed for upstairs women's restroom; looking to replace stained ceiling tiles in sanctuary overflow; discussing treasurer duties/responsibilities.

Deacons: Purchased Sheetz gift cards to help congregation members with travel expenses as needed; assisted with the anointing of Pastor David.

Other Business: Board approved giving a monetary gift to Megan Barkman in appreciation of her many years serving as treasurer. Board is still seeking someone willing to provide full or partial treasurer duties - this will likely require outsourcing to a local individual or accounting firm - Steve Ritchey & Dick Appleman will reach out to some local churches to see how they handle treasurer duties. Board discussed security measures at the church, esp. during Sunday morning worship & Wednesday night activities. Agenda needs to be set for spring council meeting.




