#### **MINISTERIAL CERTIFICATION**

As of April 2008, the Northeastern District Assembly approved the following criteria for certification for all ministerial candidates—elders and evangelists. Ministerial candidates must complete 24 credits by June of their year of ordination, as follows:

#### STUDENT INFORMATION

**Class Sessions:** Class will be held on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays Fridays and Saturdays, **VIRTUALLY.**

**Tuition:** Registration (paid once per year, nonrefundable): \$40.00. Cost per course semester: \$45.00 (each course is 2 credits per semester or \$22.50 per credit). One 2-semester course = \$130 for the year. Two 2-semester courses = \$220 for the year. Fees are collected each semester.

**Registration:** Make full payments of registration and tuition fees on the day of registration. You can pay by check, cash, or money order. A late registration fee of \$20.00 will be required after March, 18, 2023. The Registrar must receive a request for refund, if you decide to withdraw from the course, do so in writing by March 25, 2023. Tuition fees are nonrefundable after March 25, 2023.

**Attendance:** Students missing more than 2 sessions are automatically given a failing grade for the course. Three lateness's (5 minutes after class begins) count as one absence.

Grades: A letter grade system of A, B, C, D, F or W (withdrawal) is used to

evaluate student work.

**Audits:** No auditing of classes is permitted.
