Fr Matt's Reflection for the Week:



This Is Holy Week

One of the things I remember about Holy Week from my childhood was that mum and dad always put a poster up in the lounge window. It came from The Universe newspaper, I think. It was an image of Christ on the Cross with the words "This is Holy Week". There was a bottom section which could be folded down for Easter Sunday with the words "He is Risen". I don't remember much else about Holy

Week, apart from Palm Sunday, Good Friday; hot cross buns; an awareness of spring in the air and then Easter Sunday!

There's a lot more to Holy Week, though. As children we never experienced this. As my parents became more involved in parish life when they were older they came to discover the treasures of the liturgy which so many miss out on. I only came to appreciate this at the age of 29. You see, Good Friday is part of the 'The Sacred Paschal (Easter) Triduum (3 days)'. This starts on Holy Thursday with the Mass of the Lord's Supper, in which we commemorate the first Eucharist at the Last Supper, and the Lord's call for us to serve each other in charity. It contains the moving "washing of the feet" and finishes with the stripping of the altar and the removal of the Blessed Sacrament to the altar of repose. This leaves the church totally bare for the starkness of Good Friday in which we commemorate Christ's passion as a salvific self-offering – "Through his wounds we have been healed" (Isaiah 53:5, 1 Peter 2:24). Holy Saturday is a day of waiting as we ponder Christ in the tomb. At sunset we gather for the Easter Vigil, with all the beautiful symbolism of the Easter fire; the Easter candle; the proclamation of Christ as the light. This is the high point of the Christian calendar (and, yes, it fulfils your obligation). It lasts about two hours and if you haven't been before then come! In the meantime, I hope you have a Holy Week ahead.
