

HOW IS THE COA FUNDED?

MCCOA has an agreement with Missaukee County that renews every 4 years coinciding with the Senior Millage. our next election will be in 2026. It makes up the majority of our annual budget. The County collects the taxes and they distribute the dollars specific to our millage to us throughout the year. It is because of that millage that the Seniors we serve are able to essentially "share the cost". That cost is based on each participants household income; our average clients pay \$5-\$10 per hour for services such as personal care, homemaking, snow removal & respite services. We also contract with other organizations to provide care for mutual clients such as Area Agency on Aging, Department of Health & Human Services (DHHS), Northern Healthcare Management for some of the people we serve. On average, we serve right around 405 seniors of this county every month.



Health & Satety - Nurse Tips From Jen

It's winter in Michigan! The cold temperatures and snowy weather lead to some dicey conditions outside. It is best to do a bit of preparation in order to help stay safe! Remember to dress for the weather when going outside. Two or three thin layers can be warmer than one thick layer. Think about getting some thermals! Gloves or mittens, a coat and hat are a must. Stay dry! Wet clothing chills your body more quickly. Remember to take frequent breaks to warm up. Keep a cell phone on you. Icy and snowy conditions can make it easy to slip and fall. Make sure steps and walkways are kept clear. Be mindful that wet pavement could be iced over. Wear boots with non-skid soles, this can help prevent you from slipping.



If you have a vehicle and have to go out in bad conditions, make sure you are prepared. Keep the gas tank full. Allow extra time to get to your destination. Make sure the vehicles lights are on so you can be seen. Keep extra distance between you and the vehicle in front of you and apply the brake and gas slowly. Keep an emergency kit in your vehicle that includes blankets, extra warm clothing, food, water, flashlight and batteries, a shovel and salt, sand, or cat litter incase you get stuck.

Things to Do!

There is no reason cold weather should stop your fun in the wintertime. It's absolutely no secret that staying active promotes good health and life longevity, These are 2 excellent reasons why it's so important to stay physically and mentally active during these months just like any other season. You just need to find your proper balance between indoor and outdoor activities - and stay enthused about it!

- Bring a bit of the outdoor garden inside create starter plants or grow herbs. This is a perfect activity for a partner (cue a grandkid and get them off their phone).
- Develop a Craft Habit The great thing about creating art is there is no wrong.
- Feed Your Mind with Reading, Coloring, & Thought Start a small book club with friends. Adult coloring books are really popular right now, write down some great memories for family history. The stimulation & creativity will do your brain good!

MEDICARE ADVANTAGE PLAN OPEN ENROLLMENT

Medicare Advantage Plan Open Enrollment Period January 1st - March 31. Whereas Medicare Annual Enrollment is when anyone who has Medicare can make plan changes for the upcoming year, this enrollment period is only for people who are currently enrolled in an Advantage plan (with or without drug coverage).

MEDICARE EXPERIENCES DATA BREACH









If you notice suspicious activity contact Medicare at 1-800-633-4227 or your local Medicare Counselors at 231-839-7839 for help. The Center for Medicare & Medicaid Services experienced a data breach in May 2023 and have identified that some individuals may have had their personal information exposed. Those affected will receive or may have already received a notice in the mail. Maximus is offering a complimentary 24 months of credit monitoring at no cost to you. You can also request a free credit report (you are entitled to one free report every 12 months). If you receive a letter and need assistance, please give us a call and we can help you navigate the process.

Tax-Aide Volunteers are available on set days and times. They are not on site every day.


MEDICAID REDETERMINATIONS


