

MESSAGE FROM OUR DIRECTOR

Hello Friends of the COA!

It's an understatement to say this last year was like no other and honestly, I really hope we don't ever have to repeat it. I know that I would never want to do it with a different team. We have had to make many adaptations and adjustments to the way that we our provide care, I am proud to say we have embraced it and accomplished it safely.

We also received a very generous grant that provided us with a large amount of Personal Protection Equipment (PPE). Employees that wanted the COVID vaccination, have received their doses, along with all of our volunteer drivers. We look to reopen the transportation services in the near future and an official announcement will be issued once we have a date. The new building is coming along quite nicely, fresh paint and some amazing volunteer donations will really help make things more inviting for seniors once we are able to open our doors back up to the public. The current regulations in place state that we cannot reopen until 60 days *after the end of Phase 6* in the reopen plan. The months of February & March we worked directly with the Health Department scheduling COVID vaccines for our residents age 65 & older. Almost 700 of them!

Thank you Lake Township for providing us with a contract so we could bring in a dedicated person to help us with the outreach of calls. The snow is leaving, the birds are singing, so get outside, take a walk, feel the sun on your face, and remember to count your blessings, they are everywhere!

While we were so happy to hear COVID-19 vaccines would be available for our senior population, we also knew that many would be faced with difficulties trying to schedule for an appointment online, ultimately only adding to the already present frustration.

Fortunately, that was a short lived issue as we were able to coordinate directly with our local Health Department and directly schedule folks for their shots.

Lake Township provided us with a contract so we were able to bring in a dedicated person for about 2 weeks to call area seniors to schedule for their vaccine. It has been a huge success, we were able to schedule almost 700 people! Our Volunteer Based Driver Program will be restarting services in the near future.

Our Transportation offers residents of the county (60 & older) rides to non-emergent medical appointments in the surrounding area. Due to COVID-19, this program has been closed for the past year. All of our current volunteer drivers have received their vaccinations.

Clients requesting rides will also have to prove vaccination & sign our policy as an acknowledgement.

Minimum of 48 hours notice prior to your appointment is kindly requested.

SPRING TIPS

CHECK YOUR MEDICINES & UPDATE YOUR MEDICATION LIST—Get rid of expired meds, make sure your med list is up to date & accessible for emergency personnel

REMOVE EXCESS CLUTTER—Keep things picked up from the floor, use rugs that offer a grip on one-side to avoid slipping. Identify & move any potential walking hazard.

GET HELP WITH SPRING CLEAN UP—Ask a relative or friend to help or hire a teenage to help with Spring time cleanup.

WALK AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE—Sitting for a long period of time is really bad for your health on many levels, get up and get moving. Even if it's laps around the house every hour. The less you do, the more you lose.

GET YOUR COVID-19 VACCINE—If you need help scheduling an appointment to receive a shot, give us a call, we can help get you scheduled.


