## 1. WHAT IS A PERSON- CENTERED APPROACH

The CPCC model has focus on that the citizens must be treated individually in a manner that reflects their own values. Personcentered care requires an individual approach based on the citizen's lifestory, dignity, and focuses on the good results.



## 2. THE PERSONAL NURSING PLAN



The personalized nursing care plan is based on the life story and the current life situation in which the citizen has received care and nursing. To get a comprehensive picture, the nursing process that consist of four main points is applied: assessment, planning, execution and evaluation.


4. DEMENTIA
