LEGACY OF VISIONARIES: HONORING VARTAN FUNDUKIAN AND H. HRANT AGBADIAN AND THE ARMENIAN MARTYRS MONUMENT"

The city of Montebello mourns the loss of two individuals who played pivotal roles in the creation and preservation of the Armenian Martyrs Monument. Vartan Fundukian, one of the founders of the monument, passed away on October 30, 2023. His death was followed by that of H. Harant Agbabian, the talented architect of the monument, who died on January 10, 2024. They left a profound legacy for their community.

Vartan Fundukian's visionary spirit and unwavering dedication were evident inhis role as one of the founders of the Armenian Martyrs Monument. His commitment to the Armenian community in both the homeland and the diaspora served as the impetus for the many initiatives he saw to fruition: from establishing the first Armenian monument on public land in the United States to establishing a community center in Artsakh to helping found the Armenian Mesrobian School. Through his commitment, Fundukian ensured that the monument stood as a symbol of remembrance and determination forgenerations to come.

Similarly, H. Hrant Agbadian's architectural prowess and creative vision were instrumental in bringing the Armenian Martyrs Monument to life. His intricate design with seven columns, each representing the of seven vilayets of historical Armenia, reaches skyward surrounded by the flame of resurrection. His thoughtful approach reflected the solemn significance of the monument, honoring the memory of the 1.5 million Armenian lives brutally exterminated by Ottoman forces. Agbadian's design serves as a timeless tribute to the resilience and strength of the Armenian people.







SPRING CLEANING YOUR ESTATE

The spring season officially began on March 20th and if you are like most people you have engaged in the annual ritual known as, "spring cleaning." There is nothing like the refreshing feeling of a decluttered home to make you feel organized and clean. A good practice to add to your annual cleanse is a review of your estate plan or following through with your resolution to create your estate plan.

There are many significant life changes and family issues that may have an impact on how you feel about distributing your property after death. Many create their estate plan and either forget or do not realize that they may need to update certain clauses or look for changes in the laws. For example, you may have already given your son his inter-vivos (during lifetime) share for a down payment on his family home and intended to provide for him during his lifetime. Another example is where one child has predeceased the parents -does that child's share past to his or her heirs? So, it is one thing to create your estate plan but it is better practice to revisit it often because some either forget or do not realize that they may need to update certain clauses or look for changes in the laws.

When taking the first steps, the most common question people ask is: how do I revise my estate plan?

First, estate planning is a process where you arrange how to dispose of your estate upon death and leave instructions for disbursement. It can be done by a will or a setting up a living trust. For the purposes of this article, I will use the living trust as an example. Most properly drafted living trusts have an amendment and revocation clause to account for desired changes by the Settlor/Trustor of the trust. This is the legal term for the "owner" of the trust. Both the will and trust may be amended during your lifetime.

Amendments and Revocation

Life changes and major family events can change how you wish to distribute your property. It is wise to revisit your estate plan every year or within a reasonable amount of time. When you change your trust it is called a "trust amendment". It is slightly easier to execute. Usually one amends their trust when he or she wants to change or add beneficiaries, change disposition of assets in the trust, or change trustees. A typical amendment to a living trust must be in writing and delivered to the trustee. The amendment will be valid as long as you follow the formalities of execution carefully.


Revocation of a trust is a little more complicated because the legal title of the trust property must to be transferred back to the owner. It is not wise to write on, strike out or hashtag any of your original documents.

Codicil

An amendment to a will is called a "codicil". It is made with the same formalities as a when executing the will. There is certain language that is necessary to reference the original will. A revocation of a will can be done by this codicil or a new will that has language expressly revoking other wills.







PUKA NACUA'S IS L.A.'S ROOKIE OF THE YEAR WITH HIS RECORD SETTING SEASON

L.A. Rams - Puka Nacua's record-setting rookie season has authored its biggest historic chapter. With his 7-yard catch in the third quarter of the final game of the season against the 49ers at Levi's Stadium, the Rams wide receiver broke Bill Groman's NFL rookie record of 1,473 receiving yards which had stood since 1960. Additionally, Nacua's 6-yard catch on the same drive in the third quarter broke Jaylen Waddle's 2021 NFL rookie record for receptions. Nacua now has 105, surpassing Waddle's 104 from that year.

"As much as (the records) will say 'Puka Nacua', I wish it could say all 11 guys out there," Nacua said postgame. " it really takes all 11. They should all feel that award just as much as I am."

That 6-yard catch brought Nacua to 1,486 receiving yards on the season. Nacua finished with four catches for 41 yards and one touchdown overall before being pulled after getting the receptions record. Quarterback Carson Wentz said the Rams would "do their best" to get Nacua those records on the final game.

"Don't do anything dumb," Quarterback Wentz said with a chuckle, when asked at postgame what was going through his mind as they tried to do so during the final game of the season. "We just kind of thought it should come naturally. It was pretty sweet to get that first touchdown for him. I think he needed one more yard at that point though, so, it was fun. I have never gotten a chance to play with him, too, so to see him in person, the plays he made - obviously we missed a couple, him and I, definitely on me - but it was fun to see that. It felt like a weight was lifted off my shoulders, I knew that was a big responsibility of me to help him get that record. Pretty impressive kid, impressive record, obviously you guys have probably seen it for a while it's been standing. Happy for him." Making the moment even more special for Nacua was the chance to share it with his family - including mother, Penina, who was in attendance at Levi's Stadium and was brought near the Rams sideline to share a moment with Nacua after he set the records. After the game, Puka handed his mon, Penina his record-breaking ball.

His mom kept his record-breaking touchdown balls from in high school when he broke a pair of those records, and Puka noted there's a room downstairs in the family's home that has "a bunch of old peewee football trophies" as well as some of his other brothers' gear.

"So I don't know where it will go in the ranking," Nacua said with a smile. "I think my brother Kai's got some gear that will be sweet. I know he's ranked up there because he's the first one, but hopefully I'll make the wall somewhere."

This historic occasion also seemed to be when he realized the gravity of his season, because of where it took him at the end of his press conference when asked about it:

The memory of his late father, Lionel, and late grandmother, Fa'aTamali'i S. Tafua.

"Today, actually, for the first time, I'm looking at just some some pictures of my family," Nacua said. "My dad started coaching my little brothers on a Green Bay Packers team in Las Vegas, so that's also

a part of reason I was a Packers fan. But just looking at family pictures and just wishing that my dad could be here to watch this moment in this game, because knowing that my family was gonna be out here. But just feeling like a calmness and a peace(ful)ness over (me), because he was watching, him and my grandmother, I know were up there. I hope they to get to watch every game, but they were out there enjoying this one with me, because there was a peace and calmness throughout the game that I was able to feel that was different from other ones, and I know they were out there with me,
