As for performances there were some that stood but that does not mean those not mentioned below did not contribute to an all round strong performance — this was a very good show. Dandini (Alison Everitt) was good throughout. She looked the part, played the part and pulled others along with her. Very well done. The Baroness, Tutti and Frutti Hardup (Sue Gough, Scott Murphy-Hill and Ian Southon) all played their roles with a nice balance of 'nasty and nice' and entertained the audience from start to finish. However, the highlight of the show for me was the rendition of 'Slipping thro my fingers' from Baron Hardup (Ian Draisey). The song suited his voice and though I would have preferred to hear him sing it alone, was the highlight of the show. He delivered it with feeling and silenced the audience with his performance. Spot on.
