Challenges in Formulating Effective Sunscreens

Developing a sunscreen with a high sun protection factor along with an elegant feel has always been a challenge for cosmetic formulators. However, with a shrinking portfolio of acceptable filters and potential changes in upcoming regulations, this task is becoming more and more difficult.

In the presentation, we will discuss the challenges that cosmetic formulators face when developing sunscreens. Typical formulation challenges such as maintaining water resistance, SPF boosting and formulating a product for multiple markets will be discussed as well as the specific challenges of formulating mineral sunscreens.


