



Community Outreach

CHBS came out to help put together furniture and deliver it to the porches of the suites built for special needs residents at Weinberger Commons. The request was urgent due to the fact that residents were set to move in and the furniture was still in boxes. We were joined by other members of the community to volunteer at Weinberger Commons. Those who helped from CHBS are Joe Sokolic, Murray Shipon, Carl Hyder and Lee Widman (who brought family members Aaron and Elisa). Our help was truly appreciated. "We Rock," according to Linda Shore Newman who was helping coordinate the volunteers.

The Weinberger commons is run by JFCS who will provide services for individuals with special needs within the complex. JFCS will be responsible for coordinating a calendar of activities and offering social and educational programs to meet the residents' needs.

In total there will be 8 special needs suites in Weinberg Commons once the second phase is complete (4 quads within each of two phases: Phase 1 and 2).

These suites are self-contained, connecting 4 individual apartments with a larger communal living area, kitchen and bath. It is important to note that each apartment also has its own living area, bedroom, kitchen and bath combining the independence and privacy of their own apartment with the communal/social needs of peers nearby. This model offers an opportunity for shared supports.

Jack Frost Mountain 1-31-2020

Allen Block, Lee Widman and Dennis Jefferson drove up to Jack Frost Ski Resort in Allen's car for the WXTU Twenty Dollar Country Radio Station Ski Day Lift Ticket. We met at Lee's house in Cherry Hill and were on the road by 6:45 Friday morning. We stopped briefly along the way for fuel and lunch sandwiches. We arrived at the mountain by about 9:30, it was a beautiful day with no wind, about thirty degrees and a nice cover of clouds, plus, the snow was great.

To interpret the ski slope map correctly you have to hold it upside down which is strange. There must be half a dozen large ten foot wide maps on the mountain, all of them are upside down. Like some other Pocono ski resorts, the configuration is also upside down, the parking lot is at the top of the mountain, which means your last run is made on the chair to get back to your car. One of the important chair lifts was not operating, they said it was closed for the season. We had some slight, but lengthy up hill poling to do at the end of the day, and that was my fault. The whole day in total was great, we skied the full day through on excellent show.

Country duo Bruce S. and Allan V. stopped in to share lunch and talk each other into and then out of skiing for the afternoon. Not to worry though we left them at the ski lodge for the Apres Ski country music show and drove to Bordentown where we had dinner and drinks at Chickie and Pete's. We were greeted and served by the friendliest folks at a time that it was hopping. After Natalie served us Lobster, Mussels and Crabs with a couple Brown Ales and an



Blue Mountain Ski Resort 1-28-2020

Brian O'Keeney, owner of the Library IV restaurant in Williamstown, organizes a ski trip each year in January. There were about 25 of us on the trip this year, we had a bus ride up and back, a full day of skiing and a steak dinner when we returned home. It was great.

The snow conditions were very good, the weather was nice and we had a nice cloud cover all day. The wind picked up a bit in the evening but it was not cold. This resort is very nice, they have beautiful new lodges at the top and bottom of the mountain, excellent snow making equipment, we skied on about two feet of snow, and no lift lines to speak of. They also utilize a high speed six person chair lift and automatic crowd metering gates at the chair lift entrance. The gate opens when you enter it with a valid ticket in your pocket. Really efficient and quick. I like this resort quite a lot now, it has improved well over time. They have a large, somewhat luxurious slope side hotel at the top of the mountain if one wanted to spend a couple of days skiing. I spent the day skiing with quite a few different folks. I tried out a new pair of slightly shaped skis but

by the end of the day I decided my old sticks are the best for me. I skied until about three PM. A real nice day was had by us all. Then back home for Broiled Haddock over spinach for dinner.

A point system will be used which will require the member to involve himself in lodge activities.


