Officer Edward Drayton began his career with the Kettering Police Department in October 2000. He was assigned to the afternoon patrol shift for many years protecting the citizens of Kettering while providing exceptional service. During that time, he was a Field Training Officer and SWAT Operator. Officer Drayton was instrumental in developing the Kettering Safe Seniors Program that helps Identify, locate and assist seniors and other qualifying residents on times of crisis.
