

## **PUBLIC ACCESS DEFIBRILLATOR INFORMATION**



In the event of an emergency **where the casualty is not responsive**, the **key priorities** are:

- 1) Dial 999 immediately** to alert the emergency services. **THIS IS VITAL.**
- 2)** If someone else is on hand to fetch the defibrillator, do this next, just in case it is needed
- 3)** Ambulance Control may ask you to **begin CPR** and will guide you. Details of how to carry out CPR can be found on the British Heart Foundation website:

- 4)** If Ambulance Control request it, **deploy the defibrillator**. If not, carry on with CPR until the emergency services arrive

**Ambulance Control** will tell you how to deploy the defibrillator over the phone AND the machine itself will tell you what to do once the case is opened!

Access codes for the defibrillator cabinets will be given out by **999 Ambulance Control**. They are also publicised in the parish council newsletter so you can note them down safely.

The defibrillators are located\*:

**Bishampton, outside the shop.**

**Throckmorton, outside the parish rooms.**

**REMEMBER: ALWAYS DIAL 999 TO ALERT THE EMERGENCY SERVICES FIRST!**

\* There is also a defibrillator in an unlocked cabinet inside Bishampton Villages Hall which can be accessed when the hall is in use.
