



OZARKS MOUNTAINEER



Thanks to a donation, the library has added much of the Ozarks Mountaineer magazine to its Ozarks collection. According to the Ralph Foster Archive, the Ozarks Mountaineer was first published in March 1952 in newspaper format. It switched to a magazine format in 1965. The magazine has an active Facebook Fan Page that quotes the magazine's mission as "... to preserve and record the history, culture, and folklore of the entire Ozarks plateau area, with reverence for the past and hope for the future." According to Missouri State Digital Collections, the last issue was published in November/December 2012.

The donation KAL received included many of the years between 1974 and 2006. You can find the magazine on the bottom shelves of the library's Ozark section, bound in 3-ring binders by year of publication. Each binder may be checked out for you to enjoy at home.
