John 10:1-10 Pointers for Prayer

- 1. "Care" seems the fundamental image here. It invites a reflection on our own experience of being cared for, in all sorts of ways. It opens us to the experience of being cared for by God in Jesus. Prayer of being loved.
- 2. Guidance is part of the metaphor. In what ways have I found myself lost in the labyrinth of life and in need of direction? Where did I find guidance? Does the word of God guide me today? Prayer of being accompanied.
- 3. In looking for meaning, when did I realise the Gospel is really not a teaching but a person? Prayer of relationship.
- 4. We all want to live and be alive, to have life in abundance. How am I at this point in my life? Where does faith in the Jesus as the gate come in? Prayer of being alive.

O God, you never cease to call even those far away, for it is your will that all be drawn into one fold. Attune our ears to the voice of the Good Shepherd, who leads us always to you, that we may find under your tender protection life in all its fullness. We ask this through Jesus Christ, the resurrection and the life, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever.

Vocations Sunday

In these days of Eastertide, as we listen to the accounts of the growth and expansion of the early Church, we see how under the guidance of God's Spirit the seeds of the Gospel are carried from the Holy Land to the ends of the earth. On this Good Shepherd Sunday, we are encouraged to pray that all Christians recognise their baptismal vocation, remembering the words of St Paul to the Ephesians that "to some his gift was that they should be apostles, to some prophets, to some evangelists, to some pastors and teachers, so that the saints together make a unity in the work of service, building up the body of Christ.

Today we are encouraged to pray in a special way for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. In our diocese, Archbishop Malcolm will be Ordaining Hugh Donleavy as a Deacon in a little over a month at St Charles Church in Aigburth. This will hopefully be followed, by 3 more ordinations to the Diaconate in Oscott and the Venerable English College, Rome towards the end of the college academic year.

Please pray for our seven seminarians and for all those discerning a vocation to the priesthood within our Archdiocese. Pray for our priests too, that our Church may be blessed with Good Shepherds who are prepared to

spend their life in the service of the sheep entrusted to their care.

We can't possibly travel to Lourdes without our supply of wheelchairs.

To coincide with our Centenary, we are hoping to fund a number of new wheelchairs. The sponsorship could be in memory of someone who has died, be on behalf of a parish, family or another organisation. Those people will then be a part of our Lourdes journey this year and for many more years to come.

The cost of a sponsored wheelchair is £400. This includes an engraved plaque, with the name of your chosen individual or group, and a fitted seatbelt.



Bleed Control Packs Installed into our Parish Centres in Memory of Ava White

Life-saving bleed control packs installed in all 37 parish centres across the archdiocese after being inspired by the work that Ava White's family have been doing since her tragic death in 2021.

Since Ava's fatal stabbing, her family have been raising awareness through the Ava White Foundation of the benefits of public places having the packs that could potentially save lives if a person suffers a catastrophic bleed. The packs are designed to help blood loss in the critical moments before professional medical help arrives.

Ava's mum Leeann White said: "We are so proud to hear that the Archdiocese of Liverpool has installed 37 lifesaving bleed control kits in Ava's memory. We can't thank you enough for all the love and support you have shown us."

#Liverpool4Ukraine

The archdiocese are well underway with plans for their 5th trip to Ukraine to deliver essential aid.

Six volunteer drivers in three vans will leave the archdiocese on Saturday, 6 May to tie in with the week leading up to Eurovision, to further strengthen the links between Liverpool and Ukraine.
