27 March 2022 Fourth Sunday of Lent Laetare Sunday

Luke 15:1-3,11-32 Pointers for Prayer

- 1. Like many a parable, this story makes its point in what seems to be unfair: the spendthrift son is rewarded and the elder son is hurt and angry. Jesus is telling us that love is a free gift, not something we earn by our goodness. This is true of human love and is also true of God's love. When have you experienced this truth in the love you have received from others? When has the experience of human love prompted you to reflect on God's love for you?
- 2. After some time the younger son "came to himself" and returned home. Where and when have you experienced a homecoming after a time of exile and alienation? What helped you to come to yourself and make that journey home?
- 3. The older son resented the welcome given to the younger son after his wandering and dissolute life. This contrasts with the welcome the father gave the younger son. Perhaps you have experienced these differing attitudes in yourself. What were they like for you? Where was there life for you or for others?

Prayer

God of compassion, you await the sinner's return and spread a feast to welcome home the lost. Save us from the temptations that lead us away from you and draw us back by the constancy of your love, that we may take our place in your household and gladly share our inheritance with others. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Healing

In the Sacrament of the Sick, the person who is ill or suffering is anointed with holy oil to strengthen them. They may be strengthened to face illness or surgery. They might also be strengthened to face death. Anointing is also often a healing act and that can mean healing of mind, body or spirit. As part of that healing we receive the forgiveness of our sins. Christ strengthens our faith and bestows God's grace in a time of anxiety and pain.

In order to make the sacrament more widely available Fr Matthew will be available after all the Masses **this** weekend for anyone who might like to receive the sacrament.

Aid for Ukraine Update (as at 25 March)



On Saturday (26 March) two vans will leave the Archdiocese of Liverpool to head to the Polish border loaded with aid for the people of Ukraine.

At 9am on Saturday, before the drivers depart, Bishop Thomas Neylon and Father Taras Khomych, chaplain to the Ukrainian community, will celebrate Mass at the St Margaret

Clitherow Centre, please keep the drivers in your prayers.

The goods will be collected by Bishop Gregory Komar and students for the priesthood from the Holy Spirit Seminary in the Ukrainian diocese of Sambir-Drohobych, who will take the goods for distribution in the Lviv region of western Ukraine. Bishop Gregory is the auxiliary bishop of the diocese and has a close association with the Archdiocese of Liverpool.

We are looking to do further shipments and will confirm details of this once the drivers have returned. Once again, thank you for your continued support, we have only been able to run this appeal thanks to the support of our parishes, schools, parish centres and local community.

Laetare Sunday

Laetare is the first word, meaning "rejoice" in the Latin text. On Laetare Sunday (as similarly with the Third Sunday of Advent's Gaudete Sunday) the Church expresses hope and joy in the midst of our Lenten fasts and penances. Call it pink, or, more fittingly, rose this change in colour indicates a glimpse of the joy that awaits us at Easter, just before we

enter into the sombre days of Passiontide.

Laetare Sunday is the Church's way of giving us a "shot in the arm" as we approach the darkness and horror of the days through Good Friday and Holy Saturday. It's an opportunity to savour and keep in the back of our minds what awaits us on Easter Sunday, the reality that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead and that our hearts will always be filled with joy!

Fr Matthew is usually available in the 20 minutes before each Mass to hear confession. He will be sat towards the front of the church, please approach him directly and make your request known.


