# 20 February 2022 Seventh Sunday of Ordinary Time

Luke 6:27-38
Pointers for prayer

- 1. Our natural tendency when attacked is self-protection and when we are attacked we attack back. We respond to an angry word with another, or to a blow by hitting back. Here Jesus suggests that at times there may be another way to act. What has been your experience of retaliation? Has it been life-giving? Have you experience of another way of acting?
- 2. When we do good to another, it can sometimes be in return for what we have received. At other times it can be done in the hope of getting something back. Or we may do it simply for the sake of doing good without any strings attached. Jesus suggests that this is when we are at our best. Recall your experience of these different ways of giving and celebrate the occasions when you gave without expectation of return.
- 3. Jesus proposes the generosity of God as a model for our generosity and says that the generous will be rewarded. Perhaps you have experienced rewards, even in this life, from generous behaviour.

## **Prayer**

Compassionate God and Father, you are kind to the ungrateful, merciful even to the wicked. Pour out your love upon us, that with good and generous hearts we may keep from judging others and learn your way of compassion. We make our prayer through your Son, Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

# South Liverpool Zero Waste What's It All About?

"It's about saving food and building community," says Kathryn Bowman from South Liverpool Zero Waste Community. "Our project is about food dignity, not food poverty, and we thank people for taking the food." Liverpool South Zero Waste Community supports people in the community by providing food bags each week which they advertise through their Facebook page. Anyone can apply for a bag and can then collect it from a local pick up point. "We don't take any money," explains Kathryn. "We just ask that people pay it forward instead, so people have done things like litter picking or made donations to other local charities." The team collects surplus food every week from Tesco and Booker through FareShare Go, which is then sorted into categories and put into bags so that people collecting all receive similar products.

Our parish is now involved in this important initiative with many parishioners collecting food donations from stores. It would be wonderful if we could grow the team already signed up, everyone is welcome, perhaps you can do some sorting or make up parcels. If you are interested then please contact the parish office.

# The Liverpool Passion Plays This is Our Story 11 April, Liverpool Cathedral, 6.30pm-8.30pm

The Liverpool Passion Plays tells the story of the last supper as well as

Jesus' arrest, trial and crucifixion. Using the Cathedral's architecture and artwork as a backdrop, the audience will 'walk with Jesus' through his story, starting as a young boy, and witnessing his entry into Jerusalem, his betrayal by Judas, and his trial and crucifixion. The performance will move West to East in the Cathedral, stopping at different locations as each scene unfolds. All will travel back to the Central space to witness the crucifixion that will take place on the performance Bridge. The combines music, script and liturgy to demonstrate what Christ's suffering and resurrection means for us today. The five acts have been put together by the cast, crew and musicians who are volunteers from the congregation, cathedral choirs and the public.
