Matthew 13:24-43 Pointers for Prayer

- 1. The owner of the field who allowed the wheat and the darnel to grow together is a reminder to us to be patient with ourselves and with others when we see everything is not right. Sometimes a preoccupation with the negative (the darnel) can blind us to seeing the positive in our own lives and in the lives of others. When have you found that a willingness to live with the messiness of the present created the conditions for future growth?
- 2. Have you ever found that it was through accepting the darnel that you learned important lessons for life e.g. learning by making mistakes, or asking stupid questions, or taking foolish risks?
- 3. The parables of the mustard seed and the leaven are reminders that seemingly insignificant things can have very positive results. Have you ever been surprised by the benefit to yourself or others of a kind gesture, a small initiative, or a word of encouragement?

Prayer

O God, patient and forbearing, you alone know fully the goodness of what you have made. Strengthen our spirit when we are slow and temper our zeal when we are rash, that in your own good time you may produce in us a rich harvest from the seed you have sown and tended. We make our prayer through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever.

Archdiocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes

Let us keep in our prayers our young people and other parishioners who are currently in Lourdes. This year, the archdiocese are celebrating 100 years since the initial Liverpool to Lourdes pilgrimage. Each year, Animate take around 500 young people to Lourdes with the Archdiocese and this pilgrimage has been running for over 35 years with coaches from across the Archdiocese taking part.

While in Lourdes, the youth participate in an array of activities.

They pray together, work together, eat together, sing together, laugh together and come away with some of the best friendships and memories that they will treasure for life.

Since 1923, a pilgrimage has gone from Liverpool to Lourdes every year, with the only exceptions being during the Second World War and the Covid-19 pandemic. Follow the link on our parish website to see memories of Lourdes through the decades.
