Sunday, 17 October 2021 Twenty Ninth Sunday of Ordinary Time

In this Sunday's Gospel, we continue to read from the section of Mark's Gospel that reports Jesus' journey to Jerusalem. Last Sunday we heard Jesus lament the particular challenges those with many possessions face in order to enter the Kingdom of God. Jesus then predicts his passion to the Twelve, who are amazed and afraid. In this part of Mark's Gospel, Jesus' words to his closest disciples seem to be intended to prepare them for the events that will occur in Jerusalem.

In today's Gospel, James and John ask to be given seats of honour when Jesus enters into his glory. Once again, the disciples seem to be selective in what they hear Jesus say. They want to share Jesus' glory, but do not appear to understand that his glory will be preceded by his suffering. Jesus notes their lack of understanding and predicts the suffering they will endure for the sake of the Gospel. Jesus says that the honour they seek is not his to give. When the other ten hear what James and John have asked, Mark reports that they are indignant. Jesus takes the opportunity to teach them.

Jesus explains the importance of service and sacrifice in the life of a disciple. In particular, he seems to be preparing the Twelve for their leadership roles in the emerging Christian community. Echoing the Gospel we heard several weeks ago (on the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Mark 9:33-37), Jesus acknowledges that his teaching is countercultural. In today's Gospel, Jesus contrasts the dynamics within the community of disciples with those shown by the rulers of the Gentiles.

Following Jesus' example of sacrificial love continues to be countercultural in our day as well. We might take this opportunity to consider our models of authority and examine our own exercise of authority. On whose example do we model our leadership?

Caring for our Sick and Housebound Parishioners

Our Eucharistic Ministers recently met together and began to consider taking how to resume Holy Communion to those who are unable to be with us in church for Mass. As we wait for the system of visiting to crank up once again, one important element is to ensure that we have an up-to-date list of all those in need of such support. So, if you, or someone you know of, are housebound and would appreciate the support of receiving Holy Communion please contact the Parish Office and leave details.

Healing

It is difficult to comprehend the impact that the last 18 months has had on us all. For some who have lost a loved one there will be the acute pain and sadness of their loss in such difficult circumstances. Isolation, mental health issues, worry about work or family all take their toll. There is such a need for healing. The Church

offers us the sacraments to help us and God's healing. Most bring to beautifully, of course, in receiving our Holy Communion, in Lord Eucharist. But also through the Sacrament of the Sick. Although the sacrament is often celebrated for those with severe illness or perhaps before someone goes into hospital for an operation, it is actually a sacrament for anyone who is in need of any kind of healing. in receiving And Sacrament of the Sick we also receive absolution, the forgiveness of our sins. In order to make the sacrament more available, especially given all that we have been through recently, Matthew will be available after all the Masses **next weekend** for anyone who might like to receive the sacrament.

Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession)

Fr Matthew is usually available in the 20 minutes before each Mass to hear confession. He will be sat towards the front of the church, please approach

him directly and make your request known.
