Church of Saint Mary of the Isle, Isle of Man,

Granted Cathedral Status

Pope Francis has granted cathedral status to the Church of Saint Mary of the Isle based in Douglas in the Isle of The announcement comes Man. following Douglas being awarded city status as part of the late Queen Elizabeth's Jubilee Platinum The celebrations in June 2022. Church will be a co-cathedral for the Archdiocese of Liverpool alongside the Metropolitan Cathedral of Christ the King, based 80 miles away in Liverpool city centre and will be the first Catholic co-cathedral in the British Isles.

Co-cathedrals are rare in the Catholic Church, but exist when two dioceses, each with its own cathedral, are merged or when a single diocese spans two distinct civil jurisdictions. The Irish Sea separates the two cathedrals in the archdiocese. Monsignor John Devine, parish priest of St Mary of the Isle, said of the announcement: "I am delighted that St Mary of the Isle has been granted cathedral status, it is wonderful news for Catholics across the island.
