

Reverse Keyhole: Four poles in a square with one barrel in the center. Run down the long side of the arena on the outside of two poles, circle the barrel in the center of the arena, then run down the other long side.

Jousting: Topple targets with your foam "lance." Target must fall off the barrel, not just tip over! Fastest successful run wins.

Barrel Race: Timed cloverleaf pattern.

Scramble (No leadline): Three weave poles, a small crossrail (ground pole for walk/trot), and one barrel.

Apple Race: Ride to a pile of apples in the center of the arena. Dismount, pick up an apple, and give it to your horse. The horse must eat the whole apple! Lead your horse back to cross the finish line. (No leadline)

Rope Race (walk/trot): Just like horseback musical chairs. Ride to the far end of the arena, stop and grab a hanging rope. There is always one less rope than there are riders. The rider without a rope at the end of each round is eliminated.

Ring Tilt: Use a foam "sword" to collect suspended rings around the arena. Fastest successful run wins.


Ribbon Figure-8 Race: Riders are paired up and hold a crepe paper ribbon between them. Fastest pair around a figure-8 without breaking their ribbon wins. (Teams combine entry fees and split paybacks)


Knock Down and Out*: A crossrail is set one stride in front of a 2' vertical fence. Riders attempt the jump one at a time, raising the jump 3" each round. A knocked down jump pole or a refusal from the horse constitute elimination.


*A draw may be called and/or riders may be eliminated for horse and rider safety at the discretion of show management.


Sit a Buck (w/t, no paybacks): Riders hold a \$10 bill under their leg while performing walk/trot maneuvers bareback. Riders who still have their \$10 at the end of 5 minutes keep it!

The undersigned also affirms that she/he is solely responsible for choosing and maintaining the horse and equipment that the undersigned uses and that the undersigned waives any claim for damages against the Sunshine Horse Show Series/Classic Country Horse Association based on an injury due to the behavior of any animal that participates in a horse show sponsored by the Sunshine Horse Show Series/Classic Country Horse Association or due to any Equipment failure or defect. The undersigned further acknowledges the Sunshine Horse Show Series/Classic Country Horse Association are not responsible for the conduct of other participants in such a horse show and their animals and hereby waives any claim for damages against the Sunshine Horse Show Series/Classic Country Horse Association based on injury due to contact of another participant in such event or other participants animal. - All entries must be accompanied by proof of rabies inoculation and negative coggins test. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 2. Exhibitors MUST wear appropriate apparel: long sleeve western style button up shirts must be worn with a collar, buttons or snaps, and western pants. NO TANK TOPS. Protective Headgear (highly encouraged for all ages) or Western Hat is required. Per New York State Law No. VAT1265, all riders 17 years of age and under must wear a helmet meeting or exceeding ASTMF1163 (Safety EquipmentInstitute Certified) equestrian standard. The parent/guardian who signs the release form for an exhibitor 17 and under is personally responsible for seeing that those exhibitor(s) in their care, custody and control obey this law.
- 3. EXHIBITORS MUST HAVE ENTRY NUMBER ON UPON ENTERING THE RING!
- 4. The gate will be closed upon a rider entering the ring and will not be opened until the rider has completed the course.
- 5. The Sunshine Show Series reserves the right to refuse any entry of an exhibitor who shows an objectionable attitude or unsportsmanlike behavior.
- 6. No horses or ponies may be entered more than once in any class but horses can be entered in more than one Section. Example: a horse can be entered in Junior barrel race and also entered in Senior barrel race. In leadline and walk/trot classes horses and ponies may be used NO more than twice in a class. Exhibitors can ride more than one horse in a class, but each horse/rider combination must have a separate entry and exhibitor number. If the same horse is ridden in different classes with different exhibitors they must have different back numbers.
- 7. A standing martingale or tie-down is permitted. An English or western saddle must be used. The saddle must correspond to the bridle. Any standard english or western bit, hackamore or noseband may be used. The method of holding the reins is optional.
- 8. Bats, under overs or crops are permissible but may not be used forward of the cinch.
- 9. Age will be determined as of January 1 of current year.
- **10. Leadline Division** is open to Exhibitors 3-8 years of age. NO Stallions allowed. Halter and bridle is required. Lead must be attached to the halter. Must be led by someone 14 years or older. Spotter is required for 3 & 4 year olds. No cantering allowed. Leadline may compete only in the Leadline Division. Riders must wear a helmet in this class.
- 11. Walk/Trot Division is open to riders of all ages. No cantering allowed. Cantering more than 3 strides can result in disqualification. Riders may only compete in the Walk/Trot division. Riders must wear a helmet in this class. NO Stallions allowed.
- **12. Green Division** horses may not be shown in another division. Riders may ride another horse in Junior or Senior Divisions.
- **13. Junior Gymkhana Show** is open to all exhibitors 17 years and younger. NO stallions allowed. May only compete in the Junior Division with the exception of Open Gymkhana classes. Riders must wear a helmet in this class.
- **14. Senior Gymkhana Show** is open to all exhibitors 18 years of age and over. May only compete in Senior classes with the exception of Open Gymkhana classes.
- 15. A \$2.00 timer fee per horse will be charged.

Day-end awards for Leadline, Walk/Trot, Green, Junior, and Senior.

Paybacks in Junior and Senior in each class. 50% of entry fees go in the Pot. 1st place–40%, 2nd place–30%, 3rd place–20%, 4th place–10%.
