THE CAMPAIGN TO RESTORE SAINT JOHN THE BAPTIST CHURCH PHASE II









Dear Friends of Saint John the Baptist,

Thanks to the generosity of hundreds of parishioners, alumni, and friends, the first phase of our Campaign to Restore Saint John the Baptist Church succeeded remarkably.

We closed Phase I in the fall of 2018 after raising \$1.3 million to repair exterior damages that imminently threatened the church's ability to remain open and operating in the future. On the following page, you will find a summary of all that we completed thanks to nearly 450 supporters.

In Phase II of our campaign, we must urgently turn our attention to the interior of the church. You know the beauty and grandeur of this place. Everyone sees it as they enter, and no matter how many times they've crossed the threshold, it astonishes and captivates. But the fact remains that there is a dire need for renovation. We must repair the plaster walls and ceilings, paint the interior, stabilize the temperature and humidity, and care for our paintings, statues, and marble. There is much to do to protect and preserve the magnificence of St. John's.

Perhaps it is quite apt that we are now focusing on the interior of the church, because I am asking you to focus inward as well — in quiet reflection on what this sacred place and community of faith has meant to who you are today. We launch this campaign with great hope that you will rise to the occasion for our beloved church and neighborhood anchor, much like you did for her in Phase I. I witnessed firsthand your love, loyalty, and dedication, and I have no doubt that we can work together to reach our fundraising goal of \$1,250,000.

As you review this case for supporting the restoration of Saint John the Baptist Church, I ask for your prayerful consideration of how you can help ensure our parish serves future generations.



REVIEW OF PHASE I

The restoration of Saint John the Baptist Church began in September 2015 with most urgent repairs to the tower, façade, and roof completed by March 2016. Additional external restoration of the windows, clock, bell, and cross continued through August 2018.







REPAIR HIGHLIGHTS

The Phase I campaign made possible the following repairs:

TOWER

- Reinforcement and restoration of church tower façade
- Replacement of the church tower's floor system and access ladder
- Installation of a new roof membrane and roof drain inside of church tower
- Complete cleaning and weatherproofing of interior of church tower

BELL

- Replacement of bell level ceiling
- Repair of the ringer and installation of an electronic toller

CROSS

- Removal, restoration, and reinstallation of the gold gilded cross on the church tower
- Lightning protection for the gold gilded cross

CLOCK

■ Full restoration of clock, including the hands and numbers, new timing mechanism, and new LED illumination

WINDOWS

■ Partial restoration of stained-glass windows, ventilators, and screens

ROOF

■ Repair of damaged areas of church's roof

SACRISTY

■ Full restoration of the church's sacristy

BAPTISMAL FONT

■ Installation of a restored baptismal font












THE NEED FOR PHASE II

There is a clear need for the interior renovation and renewal of our exquisite church. While we can celebrate the completion of the most urgent exterior repairs, we must face the damage caused by water infiltration and climate fluctuations. For years, the exterior damage and natural decay of our church allowed for the seepage of water, which severely affected our ceiling, capitals, and triforium balconies. We have an immediate need to repair the plaster as it is pulling away from the upper capitals, creating potentially hazardous conditions for those in the church. In addition, the church interior needs other restoration, repairs, and enhancements.





VENTILATION AND AIR CONDITIONING

To preserve the interior plaster, paint, and wood, as well as increase the comfort level for those coming for prayer and worship, a new HVAC system will be installed to stabilize the temperature and humidity throughout the year.

STATUES AND PAINTINGS

Statues and certain paintings will receive cleaning and restoration as necessary.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The church has some of the most beautiful Stations of the Cross in the Archdiocese. The campaign will provide funds to clean, repair, and restore our 14 stations to aid in prayer and contemplation.

MARBLE RESTORATION

The exquisite marble work within the interior of the church will be restored and repaired with a focus on the main altar of repose, the two side altars of the Holy Child and the Blessed Virgin Mary, and others as necessary.









WHY THIS MATTERS

SACRED SPACE, PRAYER, AND OUTREACH TO THE COMMUNITY

We live in an age with countless distractions, noise, and confusion — an age in which the transcendent seems distant and obscure. Saint John the Baptist Parish seeks to provide time and space where all can hear the voice of God and respond to His calling in their lives.

Since 1831, our church has been such a place, a sacred space where parishioners, alumni, and visitors can pray privately or with others, celebrate the Sacraments, and be uplifted by beautiful music and liturgy.

Attending to the needed repairs must serve the greater purpose of looking outward and forward, cultivating a heart for God and a compassion for others in our community.

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE

Designed by renowned church architect Patrick Keely and opened on April 1, 1894, St. John the Baptist is the only operational Keely church in Philadelphia, and one of 600 remaining Keely churches in the United States. The Gothic church features brilliant stained-glass windows, towering gilded pillars, complex and beautiful ornamentation, sweeping colorful paintings, elaborate and detailed carvings, a 3.5 ton clock tower bell, a magnificent, century-old pipe organ, and intricate sculptures by renowned sculptor Joseph Sibbel.

The church is unrivaled in Philadelphia for its architectural significance.
