



The Hemphill Baptist Temple of Fort Worth, TX started printing Bible portions and materials for the Bearing Precious Seed Scripture distribution ministry of the Rolling Hills Baptist Church of Fort Worth in the spring of 1967 shortly after I moved there to be on staff with Hemphill Baptist. Dad and I were both well acquainted with Brother Don Fraser, the founder, as our home church in Memphis had been supporting it since he presented the BPS ministry to our church four years earlier, shortly after BPS was founded in 1963. However, it wasn't until September 21, 1968 that this ministry was officially organized and chartered as a church operated Bible printing ministry.

Eleven years ago we resumed our annual Scripture Conferenc moving it to the third week of October each year. For this special 50th occasion, our conference this year has been extended from a two day to a four-day meeting, making it Monday, October 15th thru Thursday, October 18th of this year. Starting on Monday evening, October 15, Dr. Lou Rossi and Dr. Joe Arthur will be our keynote speakers with many, many other special guest coming to help us celebrate. More information and details will be made available in the next issue of this newsletter.

Please do not wait to mark these important dates on your calendar! We cordially invite and encourage every friend and supporting pastor of this ministry to make plans now to attend this year's conference. Dear supporting pastors, if your church has been supporting this ministry for 25 years or longer, please contact me as we would like for you to be a special part of this celebration.


However, until time for this year's conference we have much to do, more importantly, a matter of reaching our "impossible" goal of 500,000 Bibles & 500,000 New Testaments and Bible portions in 2018. Regardless of where we are with our production, we will celebrate our anniversary and have our Scripture Conference; it will just make for a better and greater celebration if our goal is within reach. Please do not write this goal off as being unobtainable as anything is possible with our God! Along with this production goal, we are asking the Lord for another 150 additional, new supporting churches in 2018 and sufficient funds to pay off our remaining \$150,000 of equipment debt. We greatly appreciate the many friends and supporting pastors who have already committed their church to a special 50th Anniversary offering for this ministry this year. Thank you!

The key to reaching our production goal this year is entirely dependent upon our success in raising sufficient funds to purchase the 24 trailer loads of paper and necessary printing materials needed to produce them. To help accomplish this; thanks to one of our supporting pastors who designed the plan; we introduced a "Bible Paper Chart" promotion in the last issue of this newsletter. When and if completed by 50 churches, it would virtually guarantee sufficient funds to complete this very ambitious goal. So far 22 pastors and churches have committed to work the chart in their church. We need 28 more churches for a total of 50 completing a chart to get us 50 Years continued on Page 2



It is called the "Valera 1602 Preservada" and it is a revision, not a new translation! What a shame that the Spanish speaking people did not have a good pure translation until 18 years ago when a few American missionaries and national pastors in Old Mexico got together and revised the original 1602 Valera. The original Reina/Valera was translated from the correct manuscripts from 1569 to 1602 but it had never gone through any purification process, had some translation errors and a lot of the old Castilian Spanish words that had changed their meaning over its 416 years of existence. American missionaries W.A. Park and Doyle Johnson were on that committee. Based upon their knowledge of the language, their skills in the Hebrew and Greek, their knowledge of the Scriptures and the endorsement of a host of Hispanics and very knowledgeable Spanish speaking Christian friends, we adopted it 18 years ago without any reservation. it. The chart is broken down into months and weeks with places for individual members to sign up for the week they would like to make their \$25 contribution with some members making more than one \$25 contribution spread out over a period of a year.

This way everyone regardless of age or income can participate and select the week and month they choose to make their contribution. There are 520 places to choose from, 10 spaces for each week of the year. When the chart is completely filled in and the funds turned into the church, it will produce a little over \$1,000 in contributions per month for paper, \$13,000 in a year purchasing 16 rolls of paper.

As is the case with any major translation work that has ever been done, and is common among fundamental independent Baptist, probably no two missionaries agree on every revision that was made but the general consensus is that it is more accurate, in line with the KJV than anything else in print. This revision has very strong support among most of our older veteran missionaries and national pastors who have made the transition to it from the old 1885 and 1909 Reina/ Valera Castilian Spanish revisions.

The opposition to it are mostly coming from the missionaries and national pastor who jumped ship years ago going to the "modern" Spanish American Bible Society 1960 translation. Since I am not bilingual, I will refrain_ from getting into the argument only to say that 50 years ago, shortly after it was introduced, over 90% of our Spanish-speaking missionaries were comparing it to the NIV in the English. Now, it appears that 75 to 80% of our American missionaries are proclaiming it equal to our English KJV. Something has changed in the last 50 years and I can tell you it has not been in the text of the 1960 ABS translation.

These missionaries that are using the 1960 ABS are also telling me that because the Hispanic people do not like the old Castilian Spanish, they will not use anything in the old Castilian Spanish. I have had some of them to admit that the "1602 Preservada" is better but the bottom line is that they do not intend to change because it would confuse their people.

For those of you who have been in this discussion in the past and may have known this Bible as the "1902 Purificado" let me bring you up to date on the name change. After this Bible was revised and the committee went their separate ways, a couple of years ago the national pastor in Mexico made some changes to it and had it copyrighted as the "1602 Purificado". Consequently, in order for us to continue to print it, it was necessary to change the name on our printing. This Bible was the original "1602 Purificado", now called the "1602 Preservada (preserved). If a Hispanic person wants a pure translation in their language, they will have to go back to the Castilian Spanish and to the "1602 Preservada".

Stateside or Foreign Distribution?

Occasionally in writing an article while quoting memory I have inadvertently misquoted a verse or left a word out and someone will usually call or drop me a note to call it to my attention. They will introduce themselves and we'll have a lovely conversation and part friends. Then there are other times, though very seldom, when someone has a complaint or criticism and drops us an anonymous note, such was the case recently. Someone who did not understand why we do not provide quantities of free Bibles and Scriptures to stateside ministries. To you sir, my answer is as follows:

Nothing would please us more than to be able to supply all of the requests that we receive both foreign and domestic but we cannot. So our priority is and has always been on foreign distribution. As tragic as it is, there are thousands of people here in the states who do not have a Bible but they do have access to them or a church and most every church that I know of, especially fundamental, independent Baptist Churches would provide them with one if they would show up at church for a service and ask. I can assure you that anyone who comes to our door requesting a Bible, who does not have one, will gladly receive one along with a personal salvation witness. It appears however, that the anonymous brother or sister who wrote the note to us is looking for a regular supply of free Bibles and Scriptures for a ministry that they are involved in.

For all church based, KJV, doctrinally sound, stateside ministries such as prisons, jails, community youth organizations, nursing homes, children's outreach ministries etc. BLMF will supply you with Bibles and Scriptures at our cost. This way we can put those funds back into the cost of the paper and materials for Scriptures

for "free" foreign distributions. As a church based ministry, we would think that your church and possibly other churches in your area could and would be willing to help you to raise some funds so that you can obtain these Scriptures from us at

Our reasoning for this policy is that the people in these third world countries where most of our distributions go, rarely have anything. Bibles are not generally available and even if they were, they could not afford to purchase them and neither do the missionaries have the funds to purchase them. Secondly, the churches and Christian friends who support this ministry understand that their support and contributions are going for free foreign distributions. Thirdly, someone has to go out from this ministry, constantly raising support, paper and Bibles sponsors in order for us to be able to fund the production of these Bibles and Scriptures. Stateside ministries are quite capable of raising their own funding. Fourthly, it should be obvious to anyone that the more Scriptures we divert to stateside distributions, the less there would be for foreign distributions.

We commend you for doing a work for the Lord and for your desire to provide Bibles and Scriptures to those who do not have them but please do not blame us for not being able to meet every need and every request that should arise, as we cannot. As much as we would truly love to provide you with an endless quantity of free Bibles we cannot. So, until we obtain an endless and adequate supply of funds producing sufficient Scriptures to do both we'll have to continue with our present policy. The only exceptions are, a "special" need for a supporting church or, a onetime gift of personalized Bible portions for a new church plant. If our churches do not survive, no church ministry will!



Production, Distribution and Financial Reports

Correction to our January "Prayer/Support" letter, we reported that we had consumed 15 trailer loads of paper in 2017 when it should have read 17 trailer loads, which was one more than we used in 2016. From these 17 trailer loads of paper, we produced 1,367,000 Scriptures, 288,000 whole Bibles, 380,000 New Testaments and 699,000 Bible portions. Of them, we shipped 1,060,363 in 22 languages going into 36 different countries with a multitude of souls being saved.


We have received confirmation that all but one of the 12 containers shipped have reached their destination safely. We have not received any word yet on the Burmese Bibles going to Myanmar. Although we used more paper in 2017, the total number of Scriptures produced was a little less than in 2016, the difference being the much larger number of whole Bibles produced in 2017.

We are so very grateful for every "Scripture Partner" and friend who partners with this ministry through your prayers and faithful financial support. Without your help, the production and distribution that was achieved last year would not have been possible. Thank you! We would also like to welcome a few new churches and Christian friends who have recently become "Scripture Partners" by making BLMF part of your

> church's mission outreach. Thank you for allowing the Lord to work through you and your church to help meet the financial need of this ministry! This ministry is a cooperative effort of many churches working together to accomplish something that none of us could accomplish individually!

As we have explained previously, when we moved into

these larger facilities, expanded our web press and collator and added a larger sheet fed press we doubled our capability but our support level did not grow proportionately. So, to help bring our production up to where our capability is now we need more "Scripture Partners" and some more paper and Bible sponsors. We thank and praise the Lord for all of you who have been a faithful partner with this ministry for so many years



From the following financial report you will see that while our support and contributions increased in 2017, we still produced more Bibles and Scriptures than we had funds to purchase the paper and materials for. We came into January of this year owing for two trailer loads of paper from December plus three more trailer loads we purchased for January. The Lord provided sufficient contributions and offerings to pay for two of the five in January leaving us a paper bill of \$90,000 for February. By cutting back to one trailer load of paper a month for February and March, we will be able to catch up but this will cause us to fall behind on our production for 2018 and our goal of 500,000 Bibles & 500,000 N.Ts. & Bible portions for this year. Sure, we can always go back to purchasing just one trailer load of paper a month, where we were five years ago, running our press two weeks out of a month and send some of our missionaries away empty handed without Bibles. But, is this really what you would want us to do, or most of all, is this what you think the Lord would have us to do?

In 2017 your regular support, offerings and contributions for paper and Bibles provided \$968,685.28 but we spent \$1,058,685.28 for paper, printing materials, shipping and operating costs.

From 1/1/18 thru 2/24/18 of this year we have printed 400,000 Bibles and Scriptures, shipped 196,000 of them with another 100,000 ready to ship. Our goal for 2018 is to produce 1,000,000 Scriptures, 500,000 of them to be whole Bibles! Please see a separate article for details.







Editor's note: Our apologies for having to preempt this article in the last issue. I was amazed at the number of comments from friends about it not being in the newsletter. I have been advised by several people to put this story into book form but now that everyone has read this column for the last couple of years I'm not sure it would be of interest to anyone to read it the second time.

Here we are celebrating the 50th anniversary of this ministry this year. My, where have the last fifty years gone, I was 24 when this ministry started, I tell people that I didn't mean to get this old this fast! I'm getting ahead of myself but with Linda's home going, April 11, 2017 was by far the worst and most difficult year of my life. While God has continued to bless and the production of this ministry has continued to increase, it was also one of the most challenging years in the history of this ministry.

Most of you have probably noticed that when you look back over your life, especially someone in fulltime Christian ministry as I have been now for 56 years, a lot of the occurrences, both pleasant and not so pleasant, all fit together like giant pieces to a very large puzzle. In hindsight, we can better see the Lord moving and working in our lives than we could at the time. Things we did not see and understand at the time, now all fit together and the things that may have been incidental and not important at the time now make sense. Over these past 50 years, the Lord has provided the right employees for this ministry at the right time with only a very few exceptions. He has provided the equipment that we needed at the right time and purchased it at a good price, able to save money by being at the right place at the right time or by knowing the right people, people who could help and advise us when it was needed. While this article is a walk down memory lane, I had

not intended for it to be quite so nostalgic but it's been so amazing how God has provided to bring me and this ministry to where it is today, not to my credit but to God's. I could not in a million years have put this ministry together and made it work out as it has, It has all been the hand of God and in His timing. I'm afraid that I may have actually hindered and or delayed the Lord's work in this ministry at times, it would have been totally unintentional of course, trying to do things my way and in my own time. But, God has so wonderfully blessed in spite of my many short comings and failures and to Him be the glory!

In the last article under this heading, I mentioned upgrading from our first and original web press in 2004 to the much better, faster more advanced web press that we have now. So let me digress just a little about that purchase. Speaking of the right people at the right time, this may not mean anything to most of you but it does to me. God was in the whole ordeal and completely in charge! Prior to purchasing a newer better web press, I had contacted several used equipment dealers and once word got out that we were looking to do an upgrade we were inundated with offers and invitations to look at presses. One of those offers was from a large used equipment dealer in North Carolina, specializing in web presses. They offered us a two unit, two web Harris M110 delivered and installed for \$200,000. Bill, the owner of the company had invited a press installer, Jim Nail to come and join us in our meeting as Jim would be the one installing the press should we buy it. We were tremendously

impressed with Mr. Nail but not by the press that Bill was trying to sell us. It looked as though our trip to NC had been a total waste of time but it turned out to be the key to us being able to purchase the press we eventually bought.

I made two or three more trips to look at other presses, only to come away in disappointment, as the better, nicer presses were all priced out of our limited finances while the lesser expensive ones were all old and worn out. I had corresponded by phone and e-mail with a dozen or more other used equipment dealers and found that even the twenty-year-old Harris presses in good shape were selling for \$350,000 to \$500,000. Because of our limited space we knew we would have to stay with a smaller web press and of the many different manufacturer, we had already determined that the Harris M110 would be the best suited for what we needed. The problem was finding one in good condition that we could afford and this was turning out to be quite a challenge. One of the lesser expensive Harris M110's that I had found was in Denver Colorado listed for \$375,000 but I had two or three other used equipment dealers to advise me to stay away from it as it had some damage from a fire in one of its two gas fired dryers so I wrote it off my list, until...! Until a used equipment dealer friend in Nashville called a couple months later and told us the finance company that held the lien on the press were now desperate to sell it as they did not own the building it was in and the owners of the building were demanding that it be out of their building in two weeks. The financial corporation in desperation had reduced the price to \$100,000 to the first buyer with the money in their hand with the understanding that it must be out of the building in two weeks. Both problems were insurmountable as far as we were concerned! Our local bank had said they would loan the ministry the money but it was going to takes weeks to get a loan processed and approved and then to get it moved in two weeks, impossible. Who in the world could we get to move that press and what were the chances of finding someone who could do it in two weeks?

Common sense said to let it go, it can't be done, but why would we ever listen to common sense when we have a God that can do the impossible! The rest is history, the finance company agreed to hold the press 24 hours to give me time to catch the first flight out of Nashville to Denver to go look at it. The press had been completely rebuilt in 1998 and was in excellent condition, no fire damage to the press, I saw it print, called Dad and said we need to buy this press but there were still two major problems, the money and the moving! Regardless of how good a press it was and how good a buy it was, there wasn't any need buying the press if we couldn't get it moved in two weeks.

I called the only web press installer that I knew, Mr. Jim Nail and asked him what the chances were of him being able to go from Charlotte, NC to Denver, Colorado and get that press out of that building in two weeks. He put another job on hold that he was working on at the time and he and his three-man crew were in Denver in 24 hours taking that press apart. Working night and day they had it apart and loaded onto 5 flatbed tractor trailers in 12 days with one day to spare but what about the money? The finance company that now owned the press by default agreed to hold our \$100,000 check for 24 hours giving Dad precious little time to find the money which he managed to do somehow some

When I met Jim we became friends but after what he did for this ministry, I love that man and he has continued to be that dear friend for the last 14 years keeping our press running. To God be the glory!
