

50th Anniversary Scripture Conference

n September 19, 1968, 50 years ago this month, a group of seven or eight local pastors, Dad, Brother Don Fraser and myself met at the church's old vacated church building on Riverside Drive in Fort Worth, Texas. We gathered around a little 10x15, 1250 Multilith and dedicated this ministry to the Lord. Little did any of us know or could we have ever imagined or have anticipated what the Lord was going to grow from such a simple, little, insufficient meeting. No one in that group had any money and all of the pastors had very small churches but we all believed that God had brought us to that point and time for the purpose of printing and producing His precious written Word, after all, no other church was doing it, so if not us, who? Those pastors all said Brother Bob, our church cannot do much but we will support you \$20 or \$25 a month. So

little compared to the size and

magnitude of the task ahead! TATell, to a man like Dad with his faith, enthusiasm, zeal, determination and a boatload of optimism it was enough. Five years earlier Brother Fraser had started a Scripture distribution ministry out of the Rolling Hills Baptist Church in Fort Worth where he was a member. One of the first churches that Brother Don introduced the new "Bearing Precious Seed" ministry to in 1963 was the Faxon Ave. Baptist Church in Memphis, TN, where Dad pastored at that time. Dad had organized the church in Memphis in 1951 after spending 6 years with Dr. J. Frank Norris as a student in the Bible Baptist Seminary and then on staff at the First Baptist Church in Fort Worth. Dad had said that he would never pastor a church in Fort Worth, but in the summer of 1966 he swapped churches with his brother John who had pastored the Friendship Baptist Church in Fort Worth for

eighteen years, later changed to the Hemphill Baptist Temple after the church moved to 2020 Hemphill Street. It's a long story, but suffice it to say, when Brother Don presented his Scripture distribution ministry to the church in Memphis it rekindled the experience that Dad had in France in 1944 all over again

Tinda and I moved to Fort Worth in February of 1967 to work with the church there as I had with Dad in the church in Memphis. As much as Dad and I were committed to helping Brother Fraser, our move to Fort Worth did not have anything to do with him or the Bearing Precious Seed ministry in any way. It was purely coincidental, at least so we thought. However, once I got settled in at Hemphill we started printing materials for Bearing Precious Seed, then tracts and Bible portions in English and Spanish for "BPS" other missionaries working in and traveling through the Fort Worth/ Dallas area. Before we knew it, we were deeply engaged in printing and Scripture distribution. God had literally pushed us into this ministry! One year later in the spring of 1968 Dad asked me if I thought the Lord would have us to do this fulltime. I thought we already were but I knew what he meant, to do it as a fulltime ministry with a goal to print New Testaments and whole Bibles for free foreign mission distribution. I said yes and the rest is history.

p until the July issue of this newsletter, I had written a series of articles about the history of this ministry up through the ministry's move to Shelbyville. 

Production and Financial Report



From January 1st through August, we have printed 1.3 million Bibles and Scriptures. We shipped

1 tractor trailer load, 7 containers and several partial containers totaling 1,223,842 Bibles and Scriptures in 19 languages distributed into over 40 countries. With the run of English Bibles that we completed in

Bible goal for the year but expect to print another 60,000 to 70,000 more in the next two months. While we are short on our whole Bible production for the year, given sufficient paper, we anticipate exceeding a total of more than 2 million Scriptures, a new record number of Scriptures produced in any given year. Obviously, we cannot produce more Scriptures than the available funds that we have

to purchase the necessary paper and printing materials.

However, even if more churches and Christian friends had been more generous in their giving this year, in light of the devil's attacks on this ministry, I am not sure we could have produced much if any more than we have. As I reported in our support/prayer letter for August 10, we have never had any time that I can remember in the history of this ministry when we have had as many mechanical, power supply, lighting, electrical and paper problems as we have so far this year. Unbelievable!

For the sake of you folks who do not support this ministry regularly and did not receive that letter, I will give you a brief run down. January - a paper jam up damaged the folder on the web press and it was down for a week. February - electrical issues on three pieces of equipment, down 3 days. In March – replaced cut off controls on web press, down 4 days. April - mechanical problem on web press and we were down 3 days. In May – our CTP, laser plate maker system was down 4 days. June - CPT down again and we lost 4 more days! Then there was July, the worst month of all: paper break problems on the web press cost us a total of 7 days! A power outage damaged the control panel on our glue binder, down 2 days! Lighting struck and destroyed a 50-ton AC unit but no days lost! A second power outage damaged the control system on our web press and it was down 4 more days! The next day our 3-knife trimmer broke down and it took us a week to find the parts and another day to get it repaired. Then when we thought there was nothing else that could go wrong our CTP system went down again for the third time this year. Then in September, the paper mill decided to delay the delivery of our paper for two weeks causing us to run out of paper and shut the web press down for two weeks. September - our web press is down again this week for some necessary maintenance and will probably be down for at least 3 days and this past Monday the drive motor burned out, believed to be the result of the last power outage.

While I do not know why God allowed any or all of this to happen, I do know, and have no doubt that He is still in total control, He knew all about these things before they happened but allowed them for our good and His glory! For that reason, I can and do praise and thank Him for the other 200 workdays when everything ran smoothly! God is good and always faithful! I have not found any possible purpose to come out of any of these problems yet, so all we can do is just trust Him and keep going! In addition to all of the time we have lost, the cost of these repairs has already exceeded \$45,000, which is more than what we spent in all of last year for equipment repairs.

January 1 thru August 31, we received \$535,947.58 in support, Bible sponsors and contributions designated for paper. We have spent \$531,952.84 for the paper, plates, ink, glues and cover stocks (\$424,436.68 just for roll paper). A lot of money? Yes! Expensive? No! The cost of producing the 208,800 whole Bibles is \$428,000 not including the cost of producing 400,000 New Testaments and 700,000 Bibles portions. Based on our most conservative estimate of 3,000 to 5,000 souls saved for every container we ship. What's the value of 30,000 to 50,000, maybe 100,000 people coming to know the Lord? A bargain at twice the price!

In addition to our production goal for this year, we have been asking the Lord to enable us to raise sufficient funds to pay off some old equipment debt that we have been carrying ever since we moved into the Bible Barn. We originally owed \$235,000, the cost of modifying our web press from 2 to 3 webs and the purchase of our 5 color sheet fed press. Some offerings that were given toward it last year brought it down to \$175,000 and two contributions this year have reduced it to \$145,000. We greatly appreciate those of you who have contributed toward this need, thank you so very, very much! If the Lord should enable us to pay this off this year, we would be most grateful! And should the Lord see fit to provide sufficient funds to include the \$45,000 that we have spent on equipment repairs this year, we would be tremendously blessed beyond measure! Please mark any contributions designated as "Equipment Debt"! Thank you!



This series covering highlights of this ministry over the past 50 years is taking so long that I am forgetting exactly what I may have already covered in previous articles and what important stuff I may have inadvertently left out, but even if any of you have been following this story, you probably will have already forgotten by now anyway. There are two very important people that I would like to highlight in this issue. These two are people without whom this ministry would not be what it is today. While I often speak of the amazing miracles that we have experienced in the 50 years that we have been producing and distributing Bibles and Scriptures, I had never thought of a worker or employee as a miracle before but these two people are! We don't have, but we could have all of the best equipment in the world and sufficient money to buy all of the paper and printing materials that we need but without the right qualified, capable, dedicated people to operate them we would be in trouble and very little if anything would get accomplished! Such is the case with these two wonderful people.

Before you ever turn a printing press on you have to have something to print. Yes, you need paper but it takes more than paper and ink. You must be able to create an image of what you want to reproduce to print. Someone has to have the ability and know how to design and create an image, an original or facsimile of whatever it is that you need printed. It takes some other equipment besides a printing press, and it takes a very smart, talented person who knows how to operate the other equipment that is necessary to produce this copy, text or image and get it ready to print.

Introducing miracle person #1: Cheryl Allen came to work with this ministry somewhere around 1985 when she was probably around 27 years old, married with a beautiful five-year-old daughter. I honestly do not remember how we met Cheryl. I'm just so proud that we did and glad we hired her to help Linda in typesetting. In those years before personal computers and before everyone had one, typesetting was a specialized field requiring large machines that set type from filmstrips. Consequently, people were not able to set their own type for books, Scripture text or the many things that pastors, preachers or Christian friends needed and wanted printed. Thus requiring Linda and Cheryl to set type for everything we were to print from the rough hard copy people would bring us that they or someone had hand written out longhand or typed on a typewriter. Linda and Cheryl would have to key every letter into our Compugraphic typesetter, which then had to be processed through a film developer with most jobs requiring a lot of paste up before being photographed to film. And in those early years those Christian books that we typeset and printed paid the salaries of our workers and overhead for this ministry so we could use the contributions and support from your churches to purchase the paper and printing materials we used to produce Scriptures. Cheryl started part-time but as the work increased, it wasn't long until she became fulltime.

In addition to operating the printing presses I had been doing all of our camera work,

producing film from the copy that Linda and Cheryl typeset using the film to produce those images to metal plates that would then be put on the presses to print. Well, when personal computers finally became more affordable, more of these selfpublishing authors started setting their own type and things began to slow in typesetting. However, by this time, our workload on the printing presses had picked up considerably and I desperately needed help with the camera and paste-up. But it worked out perfectly as Cheryl took on a whole new skill, and in a matter of a few weeks was doing all of the camera work and paste up freeing me so that I could concentrate on the web press and other printing. Do you suppose the Lord could have had this all planned out before Cheryl came to work for BLMF? I don't know about that but I do know that just anyone could not have learned the camera work and learned it as quickly as she did and later the skill to do computer design.

But her versatility didn't end there as it wasn't too many years until cameras were replaced with computers that produced text straight to film. So, when the Lord enabled us to upgrade to a completely computerized system producing film from an "Imagesetter," Cheryl moved with it and learned how to do graphic design on the computer producing those images directly to film. Then as the technology continued to advance, she made the transition from the Imagesetter and learned computer to plate. Few people would have stayed with us through all of those transitions or have been able to learn all of those different jobs, but she did and she did them very well and quickly, professionally and without complaining. Cheryl is a "Godsend" to this ministry. I'm just hoping she doesn't read this article or she might be asking for a long overdue raise.

Introducing miracle person #2: William Wade, his wife Carolyn, and their three children, son Tracy, and two daughters, Misty and Tamera had moved from Paris, TN, in 1978 or 79 to help me in the printing ministry at the Mt. Pisgah Baptist Church in Oliver Springs. William, having grown up on a dairy farm, was gifted mechanically and could fix or repair just about anything mechanical so he picked up printing very quickly and was a tremendous help to me and the ministry there at Mt. Pisgah, carrying on that ministry for a while after Linda, our family and myself moved back to Shelbyville in 1982. A little later on, William, Carolyn, and their family moved to Milton, FL, to work with the Faith Baptist Church there. William doing printing for the church part time, Carolyn teaching in their Christian School and later Tracy helping in their radio station with William also working a full time job in a local printing company.

As this ministry continued to grow, long about 1985 or 86, I called William and inquired if he would be interested in moving back to TN, this

I'm going to back up and take another shot at a subject I've already addressed several times before with very little results, hoping I'll have better success this time; the daunting question, who's responsibility it is to publish and preserve the written Word of God?

After the Lord pushed us and our church into this ministry, for the first thirty years we promoted this ministry based solely upon the value and necessity of getting the printed Word of God to the foreign mission field to those who do not have it. In other words, provide the missionaries with the tools that they need to effectively win and edify their people for the work of the Lord. But for whatever reason, few pastors seemed to share our burden and vision to get the written Word to this lost and dying World!

Dr. Bob Lemmon, Sr., the founder of this ministry, had always maintained that it is the responsibility of the church to produce and distribute God's precious printed Word but very little that we could ever say or do seemed too motivated more than a few pastors to come on board and help us! Very few pastors wanted to admit that it is the church's responsibility because to do so requires that some action needs to be taken! So, for the last ten years, I have tried to appeal to pastors and Christians that if they love their Bible and it means anything to them, why would they not want to do something to help this ministry provide Bibles and Scriptures to those who do not have them? I've not had a lot of success with this approach either!

So, I'm at a loss and for 50 years I've been trying to figure out what it's going to take to motivate more pastors and their churches to support a Scripture printing ministry. If it is the responsibility of any one church then it surely is the responsibility of every church to produce and distribute God's Word! We thank and praise God for you wonderful pastors and churches who partner with this ministry, many of you have been faithful for many, many years. Thank you! Because of you, this ministry has been able to place 40,000,000 Bibles and Scriptures on the foreign mission fields in the 50 years we have been producing and distributing God's written Word! But with more help we could have done so much more than we have!

So, here is my conclusion for what it's worth! All of these reasons are genuinely good, doctrinally sound Bible reasons for the church to produce God's Word and distributing it to those for whom nothing has been prepared! We can stress the virtue and necessity of producing and distributing Bibles and Scriptures for World evangelism but many pastors and their churches think it is sufficient to pick and choose a few missionaries and leave the rest of the world to somebody else, divorcing themselves from the responsibility of Acts 1:8, Mk 15:16 and Matt. 28:19&20. While some folks have been motivated to help this ministry because they love their Bible, I find that most Christians love a whole lot of other things more than they do their Bible! As to the matter of it being the churches responsibility to produce and distribute God's Word, some might if someone could show them a chapter and verse! But why would we need a verse to tell us to print God's Word when we are one of the privileged few that have the whole Book! As a very wise person once said, "There are none so blind as those who just will not see!" How about this verse? "to him that knoweth to do good and doeth it not, to him it is sin"!

If none of these other reasons move a Christian or a pastor to get a burden for the printing and distribution of the Word of God, just consider that you have been privileged and blessed to possess one or more copies of the only book that our all mighty, creator God has written. You are one of the privileged few who possess this priceless book and the salvation and joy that it produces, for this reason do you not feel any sense of obligation or need to get God's written Word to those who do not have it? The fact that it is God's verbally inspired, infallible, inerrant, pure, preserved Word should be more than sufficient reason to motivate every one of us to want to share it with the whole world that they may know Him! We possess God's revealed inspired Word on paper, inseparable from His only begotten Son, who is the incarnate Word! If we truly believe what we preach, that our KJ Bible is all that we claim it to be, why do we not have an urgency to make every personal sacrifice necessary to get it printed and distributed. If Christians in this twenty-first century truly loved and reverenced this precious old book with the love and reverence that our forefathers had for it, I think we'd gladly contribute our time and financial resources to see that others could have it also! Ihat generation gave their fortunes and their lives to preserve and publish it so that we might know the Lord and Saviour of that book!

No! We shouldn't need a verse to motivate us when we have the "Book"! God calls and commissions those who are surrendered to His will to go and take His Word to the "world" we are His legs, feet, hands and mouth but it's His Word that brings results! As the old Godly preacher once said, I'm just the paper boy! Sometimes we just need to be reminded that it is only through the power of His Word and the Holy Spirit that indwells us as a believer that we can and will accomplish anything for His purpose and His glory! Neh. 8:10 says that we are to send portions unto them for whom nothing has been prepared! If we think for a minute that the precious book can't stand on its own it might do us well to remember God's promise in Isa. 55:11, "So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth:...it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereto I sent it." What a marvelous picture we have of God sending Philip all the way to the wilderness to lead the Ethiopian eunuch to the Lord. Here we learn two beautiful lessons; how God can and will provide a soul winner when someone is seeking the Saviour and secondly, we observe that the eunuch had a copy of God's Word before the preacher arrived!

Second only to our very own personal salvation and the gift of the Holy Spirit that indwells us as a believer, the written Word of God is the most valuable and precious gift from God that we will ever possess in this life! Without it we would not be saved, without it we could not be saved, without it we would not have a message to preach, without it we would not have a church and without it we would all be lost and destined to hell!

time to Shelbyville to work with this ministry. He said he didn't think so as they were all settled in where they were, liked the church, pastor, and didn't think the kids would want to leave all of their friends there in the church and school in Milton, so he graciously said no. Shortly thereafter, we found a fine young man with printing experience, married with a couple of young children from out of state whom we hired to come and operate our largest sheet fed press. However, three or four months after hiring Trent, William called me and said that he and Carolyn had changed their minds and that he would like to accept the job and while it broke my heart, I had to tell him we had already hired an operator for that press. Trent did a wonderful job for this ministry for eight or nine months and then, all of a sudden and from out of the blue, he gave us his resignation with two weeks notice. He said he loved this ministry and everyone here, but that he could not continue to drive back and forth from Nashville.

After Trent's resignation, I called William back and asked him if he was still interested in the job. He said yes, so the rest is history. For these past 30 years, he has been a vital, essential part of this ministry. With the addition of another press operator, William would work back and forth between the presses when needed and run the bindery department and in his spare time help me on the web press. Then, a few months after Dad's graduation in 2014, with the realization that I could no longer continue to operate the web press and take care of my new responsibilities in the office and do some traveling to represent this ministry, William took over the operation of the web press. This is the miracle press I told you about in this article in the last issue of this newsletter. Sometime later, with his age, some health issues, and the increased production coming off the web, William asked for help so we hired and he trained a younger man to take his place on the web press with him going back to operating the bindery and supervisor over the whole shop.

Then in 2014 with the purchase of the Bible barn, while maintaining his duties in the shop, with his ability to improvise and repair things, he played a valuable role in helping to oversee and supervise the laborers working on the modifications to the building. He worked long hours doing hundreds of things that had to be done personally, things the hired labors could not do, and going along behind them repairing and fixing all the things they messed up. William contributed so much to our move into the new building, helping to move the things we could move ourselves and helping the crews moving the bigger equipment. He was responsible for securing whoever and whatever the movers needed in order to keep everything going as smoothly as possible. As difficult and as expensive as this whole process of the modifications to the building and moving all of the equipment, I cannot imagine our being able to have accomplished it without William. BLMF will forever be indebted to

The first year we took BLMF

on for regular support just as all of our other missionaries. However, during their Annual Scripture Conference in 2014 God stirred my heart to do more. to this ministry through his personal contributions to the production of the Scriptures, his mechanical gift and ability to fix and repair equipment, and his contribution of wisdom, advice, good common sense, and hard physical labor that he
