"Pressing On" is our theme for 2021 with our text verse taken from Ph. 3:14, "I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus." The Holy Spirit's choice of the word "press" implies to go against opposition. "Press" as in "pressure", was the normal way of life for the apostle Paul. While a very distant second to our Lord and Saviour when it comes to suffering, the apostle Paul had to be the most persecuted, hated and reviled preacher of the gospel to ever live. His ministry covered a span of 30 years as compared to the one year that Job suffered his great trials and tribulations.

According to Acts 9:16, I believe the apostle knew and was resolved to the fact that from his conversion forward his life was going to be fraught with great hardships, heartache, pain, sufferings and ultimately death. In this same chapter, he was let down by a rope through a window to avoid the Jews that were lying in wait to kill him and in Chapter 14, he was stoned at Derbe. In Chapter 21, we find him in prison, arraigned before the Sanhedrin in Chapters 22 & 23, questioned before Felix in 24, before Festus in 25 & 26 and under house arrest in Rome in chapters 27 & 28. Then in II Cor. 11:22 - 12:7, the apostle lists many of the trails and afflictions that he had experienced and said in vs. 9b, "I rather glory in my infirmities and in vs. 10, "I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in distresses for Christ's sake: for when I am weak, then am I strong."

II Cor. 4:8-11 he said, "We are troubled on every side, yet not distressed; we are perplexed, but not in despair; Persecuted, but not forsaken; cast down, but not destroyed; Always bearing about in the body the dying of the Lord Jesus, that the life also of Jesus might be made manifest in our body...that the life also of Jesus might be made manifest in our mortal flesh." Verse 17 says "For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory;..."

In Ph. 3:3-4 the apostle tells us "...rejoice in Jesus Christ, and have no confidence in the flesh. Though I might also have confidence in the flesh. If any other man thinketh that he hath whereof he might trust in the flesh, I more:..." In Ph. 3:5 and also in II Cor. 11:22, Paul tells us what he has to boast about, but then goes on to say in Ph. 3:7-8 "But what things were gain to me, those I counted loss for Christ. Yea doubtless, and I count all things but loss for the excellency of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord: for whom I have suffered the loss of all things and do count them but dung, that I may win Christ." Then, in Ph. 3:10 Paul tells us why, "That I may know him, and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings, being made conformable unto his death while looking forward to."

The apostle Paul was not a masochist nor was he doing penitence trying to pay for his sins before his conversion, he just wanted to be more like Jesus and

to have more of Christ evidenced in his life. In his weakness, he experienced the power of God, in his sufferings, he experienced a closer fellowship with Christ, through his sufferings, he could better relate to Jesus' death on the cross and his sufferings gave him a greater anticipation of his coming resurrection. The man who once persecuted Christ now could not do enough to proclaim the gospel and exalt His Lord and Saviour! What a consuming love, devotion and commitment the apostle Paul had for Christ, driving him to give every ounce of energy and strength that he had to the preaching of the gospel and the edification of the church.

This is the reason he could say without any reservation in Gal. 2:20, "I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me." If we only had a few modern day apostle Pauls' we would have already evangelized this world in our day as he had accomplished in his!

The apostle goes on to say in Phil. 3:13,..."But this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus." The "one" thing, the number "one" or the most important thing to him, as he wrote or dictated this book to the church at Philippi from the house in Rome where he was now a prisoner; knowing that his life was nearing an end, he says, "forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forth unto those things before". What is that "one" thing you are going to do Brother Paul? Vs. 14, "I press on toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ." He has his eyes focused on that mark, "the finish line". After 30 years of trials, tribulations and sufferings the end is in sight and he is not going to quit, slow down or turn around now! If he knew the words to the song he was probably already singing, "It Will Be Worth It All When I See Jesus"! He was not interested in a reward, or a pat on the back as he had something far bigger, better and "higher" in mind: finishing his course and pleasing his Saviour!

May God help us as Christians, to forget our "light afflictions" and press toward the mark of the prize of the high calling of God in Christ! As a Christian, we all have a calling, a work to do for the Lord, a race to run with a "mark" to reach and a finish line to cross. How are you coming on yours?

I do not know or cannot think of anything that Satan could have done that would or could have caused as much or more harm to the church, the spread of the gospel and damage to our nation as he has accomplished with this coronavirus! The bases are loaded, and the Believer is up to bat. Christians have been running the race of faith for many years - possibly nonchalantly at times due to the everyday pressures of life - but something feels different in this inning. The stakes are higher, and the opposition is stronger. Yet, within the heart of the determined Saint the Holy Spirit encourages that this is the greatest opportunity for victory. And why wouldn't it be? In a world full of chaos, uncertainty, and fear, the Gospel message rings as the thundering applause of an audience relieved to hear that there is a Way...the Way to life everlasting, triumph over death and hell, and comfort that will never forsake. While we do not know the hour that the Son of man cometh, the Scripture says He would not have us be ignorant concerning the timing of His return. I just did not have a complete list of the spouses who were present. My apologies ladies!

Our number one goal of every Scripture Conference is that the Lord Jesus Christ be glorified and honored and He was! Number two, that God's precious Word be preached with power, magnified and exalted and it was! Number three, that the hearts of those present be blessed and challenged and I sincerely believe that this was achieved as well. Our fourth goal, is that this ministry will be built up, strengthened and advanced. Then more mechanical problems, problems scheduling projects because the digital files for new language projects didn't come in when promised, months of looking for a "newer" three knife trimmer and after we purchased one even a bigger headache of getting it delivered, set-up and running, a painful process that we are three weeks into with no end in sight! Not to mention all of the difficulties shipping containers with many foreign ports closed because of COVID, three workers out for weeks with COVID and we will not even mention the presidential election. What a year!

But we are "Pressing On"! Even with all of these obstacles and challenges God has been so good, as I tell folks all the time, He proves to us every day that He wants and intends for His precious Word to be produced and distributed proving it by the wonderful way that He provides for the needs of this ministry.

I frequently have to remind myself that God knows all about the difficulties and problems that we face in this life long before they happen and that He is able to eliminate them all if it is his will! But because He loves us so much He uses them instead as tools to shape and mold us into the image of His Dear Son, for our good and His glory!

Loyd continued from Page 1 years and more frequently for the last year or two when Brother Jim's health would not permit him to preach. For all of those 24 years, Brother Loyd was without exception faithful, respectful and submissive to Pastor Tedder and likewise, Brother Jim loved and trusted Brother Loyd. It was also Brother Jim's desire and recommendation that Victory would call Brother Loyd to succeed him as pastor.

On Sunday, September 27, Brother Loyd was presented to our church as our first candidate for pastor and two weeks later on October 11, by an almost unanimous vote, he was extended the invitation which he graciously excepted. Most of the members thought it was an obvious choice for our church as pastor and the transition has been wonderful, after being Brother Jim's understudy for 24 years who would be more prepared, qualified and deserving than Brother Loyd.

Brother Loyd was eight years old when his parents Brother Shelton, Sister Linda Warren and brother Lyn moved to Shelbyville sometime around 1980. Shortly after joining Victory, his Mom and Dad started our bus ministry here at Victory with Loyd, Lyn and a later a little sister Lydia helping work the bus routes. As the kids grew older they contributed greatly to the success of the bus ministry.

When Brother Loyd, then Lyn and sister Lydia went off to Bible College, with the help of a few other workers, volunteer and their grandkids, Brother Shelton and Sister Linda kept working the bus ministry and it is still going after 40 years. Loyd, Lyn and Lydia have grown up in Victory, serving the Lord has been their desire all of their life. Brother Lyn is principle at Victory Baptist Academy and Lydia is married to a preacher serving the Lord in youth ministry in another state.

From one bus to two, then three, four and five, these buses have been bringing in 80 to 120 boys and girls every Sunday for 40 years. Only heaven will be able to reveal someday how many hundreds if not thousands of boys and girls have trusted the Lord because of this family.



In presenting this ministry in churches, I cannot count the number of times I have had a pastor tell me that their church is already supporting all of the missionaries and ministries they have money to support. I understand and know that this is a problem in many churches! Well, for all of you, this chart is a method that will enable you and your church to get involved, or more involved in the publishing and the distribution of God's written Word without taking funds from your church's mission budget or regular tithes and offerings.

One of our "Bible Paper Charts" can if worked, accomplished three very important purposes for the work of the Lord while benefiting your church at the same time! First, once everyone understands that this offering is to be given over and above their regular tithes and offerings, it shifts the giving decision from the pastor to the individuals in your congregation. This becomes apparent as soon as the individual who is willing to make a contribution realizes that this is a personal matter between them and God, that they are the one deciding how much they will give by faith and deciding for themselves when the best and most convenient time is for them to give. Secondly, it encourages an individual to exercise faith in their giving which will work to grow a more mature Christian benefiting your church spiritually! Thirdly, whatever the amount of the offerings are that your Bible Paper Chart raises, it is providing much needed funds to produce more of God's written Word for those who otherwise might not receive it.

It also accomplishes one more thing that I consider to be very important, it separates and distinguishes the funds that are given to support missionaries from those that are given and designated specifically to produce God's written Word. Supporting missionaries and producing God's written Word are two different areas of responsibilities of the church. We ship these Bibles and Scriptures to missionaries in different foreign countries to be used as tools for the purpose of world evangelism because these foreign countries are where the greatest need is.


Regardless of where they are distributed, the church has a responsibility to print God's written Word because it is the Word of God! We produce God's Word because it is God's verbally inspired, infallible, inerrant, pure, preserved Word, and then we decide where God would have us to send them! Being obedient to our responsibility to produce God's Word then provides a solution for another need, providing Scriptures for foreign field distributions!

Of the few churches who have availed themselves of and are using these Bible Paper Charts, most of them are churches who also already support this ministry through their regular mission support. If a church is not financially involved in the production of God's written Word, in essence they are sending their missionaries they support to a foreign country without giving then any tools by which they can reach and minister to the people that God has called them too!

To a Christian, the greatest gift that you have ever received from God is your salvation, but to an unsaved individual, the most import gift from God that they can ever possibly receive is God's Word either written or spoken! Regardless, without God's precious Word none of us could or would be saved, without it we would not have a message to preach or a Bible to print, without it we would not have a church and without it we would all be destined for a Christless eternity!

The actual size of the chart is approximately 4ft. by 4ft. made to be mount on a wall so that those participating will be reminded of their commitment, others challenged and encouraged to participate and an opportunity for everyone to rejoice over what is and has been accomplished for the glory of God.





In light of the political situation in our country today, the civil unrest and rioting, the attacks on the church and Christianity plus the coronavirus, most Christians and even some non-Christians are wondering if the Lord's coming could be near and rightfully so! While some of us are praying that it is, the Bible says we are to occupy until He comes so we must keep "Pressing On" and keep planning for tomorrow as though His return may be months or possibly years away! According to the signs of His coming we know that His return is near. However, these signs are not given so that we will have time to stock pile food, water, weapons and go hide in a cave but rather, to compel and motivate us to do so much the more to serve God and evangelize the world as we see that day coming!

In this ministry, we feel that there is an "urgency" to get as much of God's Word produced and distributed as we possibly can and to do it as soon as we possibly can! Just think, when Christians are raptured out there will not be any more preached Word for some time, so the only light of the gospel left in this world will be the printed Word! So what can we do to produce more of God's Word you ask?

I'm so glad you asked! With some additional funds to purchase more paper and printing materials this ministry has the capacity to produce one-third more Scriptures than we have this year. Using a scale based on trailer loads of paper. This year we will use 20 trailer loads to produce 1.6 million Scriptures, our goal for 2021 is to produce 2 million Scriptures requiring 24 trailer loads of paper, but barring an unusual number of mechanical problems, I believe our web press is capable of consuming 30 trailer loads of paper in 12 months.

Thirty trailer loads of paper will produce 2.5 million Scriptures so the bottom line is; it all depends on how "urgent" growing our production is to those churches who are not engaged in the production and distribution of God's written Word!

Of all of our equipment, our web press is the key to our production, the most essential and unfortunately, also the most expensive. When we purchased the web press that we have now in 2004 it was 6 years into a completely almost new condition making it 22 years old this year. While I hope we will exceed the capacity of our web press in two to three years, we may not be able to depend on this press mechanically to get us there. Either way, we need to start planning for the time we will have to replace it.
