Why Be Afraid??

So they went out quickly and fled from the tomb, for they trembled and were amazed. And they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid. — Mark 16:8, NKJV

One of the more puzzling aspects of St. Mark's Gospel is his ending. Chapter 16, verse 8, seems out of place for Easter Morning. The women stand around in fear of what is going on. Still, the other Gospels show all the disciples, including the Apostles, to be confused and fearful at what was happening. This is not totally surprising. All Sabbath Day they were in their homes, by themselves, trying to make sense of Jesus' death. As Cleopas and his friend told Jesus when walking to Emmaus, "we were hoping He was the Christ." But His crucifixion seemed to have dashed their hopes.

So when Easter morning came, the fears and doubts they harbored in their homes that Saturday spilled over into Sunday. The problem: they looked to themselves to explain what they saw, felt, and experienced, rather than looking to God in His Word, especially Christ's Words which He had preached and taught. Looking inside their own hearts, minds, and intellects they saw only fear and doubt. Had they instead recalled Jesus' promises, those fears would have vanished.

This was not the first time in Mark's Gospel that Jesus' followers, both women and men, had been afraid when they saw things happening. The first time was after Jesus had liberated the man possessed by Legion across the Sea of Galilee:

Then they came to Jesus, and saw the one who had been demon-possessed and had the legion, sitting and clothed and in his right mind. And they were afraid. (Mark 5:15)

Shortly thereafter, Christ had been asked to save a little girl near death. Mark tells us that

While [Jesus] was still speaking, some came from the ruler of the synagogue's house who said, "Your daughter is dead. Why trouble the Teacher any further?" As soon as Jesus heard the word that was spoken, He said to the ruler of the synagogue, "Do not be afraid; only believe." — Mark 5:35-36, NKJV

Their fear could only be calmed through believing and trusting Jesus. The same held true later when Jesus proved His power by calming the raging sea:

And when they saw Him walking on the sea, they supposed it was a ghost, and cried out; for they all saw Him and were troubled. But immediately He talked with them and said to them, "Be of good cheer! It is I; do not be afraid." — Mark 6:49-51, NKJV

Once more, if they had only discounted their own faulty reason and trusted Christ, their fears would have disappeared. **Continued on page 2** >>

Upon the Mount of Transfiguration, Peter, James, and John would have been better off just listening to what Jesus had to say. We can obviously excuse their fear at God's Almighty appearance, but even then simple trust in what Jesus was saying would have calmed them: Then Peter answered and said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; and let us make three tabernacles: one for You, one for Moses, and one for Elijah"—because he did not know what to say, for they were greatly afraid. — Mark 9:5-6, NKJV

Next, the disciples were naturally afraid not only for Christ's life, but their own. Yet again, just trusting Jesus' words, "He will rise the third day," should have calmed them. Instead of "overthinking" what Christ was saying, they should just have believed what He was saying: For He taught His disciples and said to them, "The Son of Man is being betrayed into the hands of men, and they will kill Him. And after He is killed, He will rise the third day." But they did not understand this saying, and were afraid to ask Him. — Mark 9:31-32, NKJV

Again fear came to all, women & men, Palm Sunday when they drew nearer Jesus' rendezvous with the Cross: Now they were on the road, going up to Jerusalem, and Jesus was going before them; and they were amazed. And as they followed they were afraid. — Mark 10:32

So the women's fear on Easter came from using reason and senses, apart from the Word of God, to make sense of the world. Modern man is unnecessarily proud of his intellect and reason. This is really nothing new, though. Already in the Garden of Eden one temptation of eating the fruit was that it came from "a tree desirable to make one wise." To this Day, humanity arrogantly takes sinful pride in being 'intelligent', pretending to be able to figure out life apart from what God says.

So also the women of Mark 16:8. Their temporary fear at seeing Roman guards frozen in fear, the tomb with the stone rolled away, and "a young man clothed in a long white robe sitting on the right side," which Mark also tells us made them "alarmed," was just not easily explained by reason and senses. Just like Peter and John when they arrived at the tomb, they had "not yet known the Scripture that He must rise again from the dead." If they had sooner let God's Word tell them the meaning of what they beheld with their eyes, their fears would have sooner been turned to joy in Christ.

If you are fearful of anything in life, try first looking to God's Word to explain life. His Word explains why our world is so corrupt and chaotic. His Word tells us what God is doing to protect and rescue us. Mainly, His Word gives us the sure and certain hope that since Christ is Risen, our eternal life has begun in Him. Even more, His Word tells us we need not fear, though our World descends deeper into sin and insanity. God's Word assures us we shall be rescued by our Risen Savior, even Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen!

And it happened, as they were greatly perplexed about this, that behold, two men stood by them in shining garments.


Then, as they were afraid and bowed their faces to the earth, they said to them,


