The path traverses a deep valley called Reen Woods. The Woods are designated 'Common Land's' under the Commons Act 2006.

This gives the public rights of access and to follow the stream to the bold outcrop of Reen Rocks, St. Ia Cell and the remains of an early medieval Chapel.

One of the most important archaeological sites in Cornwall it is a place of deep sanctuary and meditation.
