## Our Republican Candidates Need Your Support to Overcome Staggering Financial Inequalities

A member of the executive team recently called my attention to a situation that seems to put our candidates at a considerable disadvantage.

The most recent campaign finance reports paint a bleak picture. As of August 30th, Attorney General candidate Eric Toney had a fund balance of \$120,000 compared to Josh Kaul's \$2.2 million, and Governor candidate Tim Michels had a balance of \$1.2 million compared to Tony Evers' \$6.2 million.

Moreover, the vast majority of Michels' money came from his own pocket, whereas most of Evers' money came from the Democrat party and other individuals.

How could Republicans allow this to happen? First, this is due to the divided energy produced by primary elections during which Republican resources were split among several candidates. Second, a lot of out-of-state money is flooding into the left's coffers.

How do we overcome this financial hurdle and help our candidates move on to victory at the polls on November 8th?

Make a campaign contribution today. The last several weeks before an election are a critical time to persuade people to vote.
