
Blessing to You Common Ground!

We have entered into a season in the Church known as Lent. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, a day which focuses our attention on the cross and our need for repentance. A symbol of repentance and brokenness taken straight from the Bible is ashes. It is why ashes are placed on the forehead of participants of an Ash Wednesday service. These ashes represent our repentance from sin and remind us of how fragile our lives are. We are dust, and to dust we will return (Genesis 3:19). That is why we so desperately need Jesus!

As we enter the season of Lent, I want to invite you to join me in renewing our focus on Jesus. You can do this by fasting, or "giving something up" for Lent, but don't feel limited to that method. You might already feel weary from a year filled with giving up so many things! So, try thinking of it this way: Let's look for ways to turn-up the volume on Jesus in our lives for the next 40 plus days. What could that look like? Here are some ideas:

- Commit to say "thank you Jesus for..." every time you are frustrated, upset or challenged in your day.
- Do something extra kind for someone else each day.
- Take a walk each day and pray. Try listening more than speaking.
- Find a good worship album and pay close attention to the lyrics. Sing along with intention.
- Write a letter a day to Jesus.



During Lent we will also be starting a new sermon series called "Beauty for Ashes." Each Sunday during Lent serves as a celebration of the life found in Jesus. Out of sin and brokenness Jesus brings beauty, brings life! If you have a beauty from ashes story or testimony you would like to share in a service over the coming weeks, please let me know!
