



News from St Peters

Richard Cunningham, Headteacher writes....

With an early Easter this year, we had the rare and special opportunity to be in school with the pupils right up to Maundy Thursday. This meant that we were able to bring the season of Lent almost to its culmination as a school and faith community, with Stations of the Cross and a Penitential Service on Tuesday 26th March, and then a Liturgy centred around the Passion of Christ at the end of the school day and term on Thursday 28th March. Additionally, during this most recent season of Lent, the Sacrament of Reconciliation was offered in school. We started with one Year 6 class, who enjoyed a session with Fr Jeremy and Fr James explaining the sacrament in supplement to the learning pupils do in RE, and then Mrs Semple our school chaplain facilitated pupil activities whilst the sacrament or a simple blessing was offered to the pupils.

Admittance to Hospital?

When a Catholic is admitted to hospital, the family should ensure that the Catholic Chaplaincy is contacted so that appropriate support can be given. It is suggested that the patient have a note to give to hospital staff on admission, notifying staff that they are Catholic and would appreciate the Catholic Chaplaincy service. This could be followed up by a telephone call from the family to the ward to ensure the request is actioned. When a person is due to go into hospital please also let your parish priest know so that he can administer the Sacrament of the Sick where appropriate.

I warmly invite you to join me and fellow pilgrims on our annual pilgrimage to Lourdes, one of the most significant pastoral events in the Diocesan calendar. This year's pilgrimage is from *Monday 22nd – Friday 26th July 2024...*

Pope Francis has dedicated 2024 to being a Year of Prayer. Pilgrimage is a very particular form of prayer, a time when we don't only speak words to God, but act with our bodies to come to a particular place. Lourdes has been a place of special prayer for over 160 years since Our Lady appeared to Saint Bernadette in 1858.

Lourdes holds a special affection in the hearts of many across the Diocese and these trips are wonderful opportunities to experience faith, fun and friendship. I very much hope that you will consider joining me and fellow pilgrims when we depart from London Gatwick Airport on *Monday 22nd July*.

We will be staying close to the Sanctuary at the four-star Hotel La Solitude which enjoys panoramic views of the upper town and the Pyrenees. The hotel boasts en-suite rooms with tea and coffee-making facilities and a comfortable restaurant with a varied and plentiful menu.

We have an itinerary which takes full advantage of all that Lourdes has to offer, which include participation in all the usual Pilgrimage activities. Pilgrims visit many places that were important to St Bernadette during her lifetime as well as offering the opportunity to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick. During our pilgrimage there will be moments of quiet reflection and peace, as well as times when we will be able to hear the chanting and singing of hundreds of voices.
